#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, in the county of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs, you are hereby notified to meet at Hayes' hall in said Hanover, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2d. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 2A. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools.
- 3d. To see if the town will vote to have a liquor agent for the ensuing year.
- 4th. To see what sums of money the town will vote to appropriate for defraying the expenses of Old Home Week Association for the ensuing year.
- 5th. To see what action the town will take in relation to the town farm, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 6th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

At the annual town meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, qualified to vote in town affairs, at the hall of C. W. Hayes in said town, on the second Tuesday of March 1900, the following town officers were elected, viz:

Town Clerk, George M. Bridgman.

Selectmen, Edward P. Storrs, Albert Pinneo, and Don S. Bridgman.

Treasurer, Daniel B. Russell.

Auditors, John V. Hazen and John M. Fuller.

Library trustee for three years, Asa W. Fellows.

Highway agents, Edward L. Clifford, Fred L. Marshall, and Ransom S. Cross.

Voted—To raise the sum of one thousand (\$1000) dollars for the support of schools.

Voted—To raise the sum of twenty-five hundred (\$2500) dollars for the general expenses of the town.

Voted—To raise the sum of fifty (\$50) dollars to help defray expenses of Old Home Week.

Voted—To raise the sum of fifty (\$50) dollars for the purpose of painting and repairing the hearse belonging in the easterly part of the town.

Voted—To raise the sum of fifty (\$50) dollars for the purpose of repairing the hearse in the westerly part of the town.

Voted-To establish a liquor agency.

Voted—The sum of fifty (\$50) dollars to L. D. Gove Post, No. 56, to help defray the expenses of Memorial Day, May 30th, 1900.

Moved that the selectmen be instructed to manage the town farm to the best of their judgment as a poor farm.

In favor of the motion 77 votes
Against the motion 58 votes
and the motion was declared carried.

Voted to accept and adopt the reports of the town officers as published in the annual report.

Voted—That upon all taxes paid on or before the 15th day of July, 1900, a discount of 5 per cent be allowed the tax-payer, and upon all taxes paid on or before the 15 day of September, 1900, a discount of 3 per cent be allowed the taxpayer.

Voted—That the Selectmen pay upon the note held by the Dartmouth Savings Bank against the town, known as the "hospital note," such a sum as the state of the treasury will permit.

We herewith submit a general summary of the leading statistics of the combined schools. Tabular statement for each of the schools will be found on the last page of this report.

The statistics for the winter term cover only the six weeks prior to the publication of this report.

These figures show no essential change from last year. There was a slightly larger enrollment and a pleasant gain in the visits of friends of the school.

In the High School the distribution of work was as follows:

This is an increase of three over last year which was then an unusual number.

There have been 34 tuition pupils during the year and about \$375 has been received from that source in tuition.

During the year the committee have done away with an anomaly that heretofore existed as to graduation. As previously managed, those who had completed three years of High School study were graduated, and came back as postgraduates for the fourth year. This was an entirely unsatisfactory arrangement and hereafter graduation will follow the completion of the entire course.

With the introduction of the English course last year the committee felt that the above change could work no hardship and would give dignity to the entire work of the High School. The new plan does not apply to the present Senior class.

During the year it has been necessary to increase the number of grades to nine, which is the usual number in all public schools.

With only eight grades the work of the seventh and eighth grades has been crowded and the pupils unable to do their best work in the High School.

The change from the grammar grades to the High School has been too abrupt often to the injury of the health of the pupils. The introduction of the extra year will permit a better distribution of the work in both Miss Bickford's room and in the High School. For the present the ninth grade will be a part of the High School where it can be managed without any increase in the teaching force, though it naturally comes in the Grammar School.

The change will not affect this year's class and the adjustment of the classes to the new programme will be gradual. Ultimately the course will be a year longer than at present. The work of the ninth grade will be in ancient History, a thorough drill in English grammar and composition, elementary Algebra and Geometry, with a review of Arithmetic.

A short afternoon recess for the whole school has been introduced during the year. It was thought that the long uninter-

rupted session was bad for the pupils and unfavorable to good work in the latter part of the afternoon.

With the exception of the second primary room there have been no essential changes in the teaching force since the last report.

Principal Kaharl has continued his successful management of the High School and Miss Flint her efficient services as first

assistant.

Mr. Howe has succeeded Mr. Lewis as the instructor furnished by the president of the Moor's Charity School, and Mr. Buck of the College is also giving some instruction without cost to the district.

The whole arrangement is working smoothly and to the great advantage of the School.

In the second primary school Miss Allen was released at the beginning of the Winter term to accept a position in Manchester, and Miss Applebee, a graduate of the Plymouth Normal School, has been engaged to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the year. Miss Rowe took Miss Downing's place at the opening of the Fall Term. We desire to acknowledge Miss Downing's long and faithful services.

The number graduated from the High School last year was unusually large, being eleven. Of this number four have returned for the post-graduate year, one has entered college and six are pursuing their studies in other institutions.

A sum of one hundred dollars has been expended for physical apparatus and for the first time it has been possible to take up the study of Physics under the Experimental Method.

The system of half day sessions for the three lowest rooms has worked well during the year in which it has been tried.

The degree of Nature study that it has been possible to introduce has entirely justified its introduction two years ago.
