THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants in the town of Hanover in the County of Grafton, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in the town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Nugget Theatre in said Hanover on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2nd. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3rd. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate in all or part to be expended as may be necessary under the direction of the selectmen in co-operation with the state and federal agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread of the disease commonly known as pine blister rust.

4th. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for lighting the streets of Etna.

5th. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the sidewalks in Etna.

6th. To bring in your ballots upon the question as to whether the amendment proposed by the convention to revise the Constitution shall be approved.

7th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may be legally brought before said meeting.

You are hereby notified to meet in the Nugget theatre in said Village, on Tuesday the 13th day of March, 1923, at 8.00 P.M. o'clock, to vote on the following subjects:

First: To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting, the same to be chosen by ballot.

Second: To choose by ballot a clerk to serve for the term of one year.

Article 5: Voted to raise the sum of \$10,500.00 for expenses as itemized in the budget for 1922-1923.

Article 6: Voted to pass Article 6 as this was included in the budget for 1922-1923.

Article 7: Voted to raise the sum of \$400.00 the same to be used by the Precinct Commissioners to secure open air band concerts to be given in the Village of Hanover in the months of July and August, 1922.

Article 8: Voted that the Curfew Law as now in operation be adopted, and that the Commissioners be authorized to provide for the proper Curfew signals.

Article 9: Voted that the Precinct Commissioners be and hereby are authorized to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Village Precinct before the taxes are raised, collected and paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the Precinct.

Voted that upon all taxes on personal property and upon real estate paid on or before the first day of July, 1922, a discount of five per cent be allowed the tax payer, and that upon taxes on personal property and real estate paid on or before the fifteenth day of September, 1922, a discount of three per cent be allowed the tax payer.

Voted that the thanks of the Precinct be extended to F. F. Davison for the use of The Nugget Theatre for this evening.

Meeting adjourned at eight fifty-five p. m.
