THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hanover, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Hayes' hall in said Hanover, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January session, 1905.
- 4 To see if the town will vote to have a liquor agent for the ensuing year.
- 5 To see what sum of money the town will vote, raise and appropriate to defray the expenses of observing Old Home Week.
- 6 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not exceeding six hundred dollars (in addition to the present building fund) for the purpose of enabling the trustees of the Hanover Public Library to erect a brick library building.
- 7 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars to purchase a steam road roller for Hanover precinct.

- 8 To see if the town will vote to appropriate money to suitably mark the graves of the soldiers of the Revolution and other wars, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 9 To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen, or pass any vote relating thereto and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover qualified to vote in town affairs, on the second Tuesday of March, 1904, the following named officers were elected:

Town Clerk, George M. Bridgman.

Selectmen, Edward P. Storrs, Albert Pinneo, and Don S. Bridgman.

Treasurer, Daniel B. Russell.

Auditors, John H. Foster and John V. Hazen.

Highway agents, Edward L. Clifford, Adna P. McPherson, and Ransom S. Cross.

Fence viewers, Frank A. Adams, James Spencer, and William D. Chandler.

Sealer of weights and Measures, Luther B. Newell.

Surveyors of wood and lumber, David B. Pelton, and Horace L. Huntington.

Liquor Agent, Daniel B. Russell.

Prosecuting Agent to prosecute violations of the liquor law, Arthur P. Fairfield.

Library Trustee, for three years, Horace F. Hoyt.

Voted to raise the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2500) to defray the general expenses of the town.

Voted to raise the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2000) • for the support of schools in excess of the amount required by law.

Voted to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) to help defray the expenses of Old Home Week Association.

Voted to raise the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350) as an additional appropriation for printing and publishing Vol. 1 of early town records, 1761 to 1818.

Voted to accept the reports of the town officers as published in the annual town report.

Voted that upon all taxes paid on or before the fifteenth day of July, 1904, a discount of five per cent. be allowed the tax payer, and upon all taxes paid on or before the fifteenth day of September, 1904, a discount of three per cent. be allowed the tax payer.

Voted that the Highway Agents look over the old Wolfboro road and report at the next town meeting the probable cost of putting said road in a passable condition.

BOARD OF EDUCATION, DISTRICT NO. 1

We herewith submit our report upon the work of the schools of the Village Precinct of Hanover for the spring term of the year 1903-4 and the fall and winter terms of the year 1904-1905.

We have been fortunate in retaining the services of Principal Woodbury and the two regular assistants in the High School; their efficiency had been well proved before, and they have this year secured better results than ever. The College has furnished from its Graduate Department of Pedagogy, without expense to the District, three teachers for the spring term, and four for the rest of the year. All are men who have specialized throughout their college course in the lines in which they are teaching. Their work is under the constant supervision of Director F. C. Lewis of the Department of Pedagogy, in cooperation with Principal Woodbury. Their help enables the school to do work altogether in advance of that of most schools of this size.

The High School now offers a full college preparatory course, and its work is sound and progressive. The graduates of the school who entered the Freshman class of the College last year have attested the thoroughness of their training by maintaining very high rank among the graduates of the best New England schools.

By the extension of the course from four years to five the class that would have graduated last June have remained in the school, to graduate in June of this year.

The course of study of the High School has this

year been revised and printed. Copies may be had by application to the Principal.

The spirit of school loyalty and ambition has been steadily increasing. The hall has been frequently used for school entertainments, the scholars have been active in raising money to provide pictures and busts for the school-rooms, and a healthy interest in school athletics has been developed.

The superior training that Miss Cowles has been giving in the department of English has led to an arrangement by which the pupils will maintain a department in the Hanover Gazette.

The school has an increasing patronage from outside the district, which adds to the income, and brings scholars who are able and in earnest. The work of the other grades has been in general steady and satisfactory. With the greatest reluctance the Board accepted in June the resignation of Miss Bickford, who had for eleven years made the Grammar School a model of orderly and efficient work. Her influence both upon the schools below and above her own has been one of the greatest factors in the development of our school system. She was succeeded by Miss Harriet A. Storrs, a graduate of Mt. Holyoke College, who had taught successfully in the Norwich Schools.

Miss Rowe, who had for four years made our primary room a place of delight for the youngest children, and who had won a place in the gratitude and love of all their parents, decided to stop teaching at the close of last year. Her work was handed on to her classmate in the Johnson, Vt., Normal school, Miss Rena J. Johns. The work has gone on without a jar, and the high reputation of the school is fully maintained.

Miss Jones and Miss Applebee have carried on their work in the other grades with the same faithful and wise energy that had already placed their success beyond question. In the material equipment of the schools the most important addition has been an iron fire escape of the best model, made easily accessible both from the third and second floors. The cost was \$325.00. We can now use the third floor of the building with entire safety.


