THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Hanover in the County of Grafton in the State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Trumbell's hall in said Hanover on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2nd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3d. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, the same to be expended or such part thereof as may be necessary, under the direction of the selectmen in co-operation with the state and federal agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread of the disease commonly known as pine blister rust. It being understood that a like amount shall be available from both the state and federal governments.

4th. To see what sum of money the town will vote, raise and appropriate to defray the expenses of observing Old Home Week.

5th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum to pay for a motor vehicle to be used by the town Highway Department.

6th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may be legally brought before said meeting.

ABSTRACT FROM TOWN CLERK'S RECORD

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, qualified to vote in town affairs, on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, 1918, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at Trumbell's hall in said town, the meeting was called to order by Frank A. Musgrove, moderator pro-tempore, the warrant under which the meeting was called was read by the clerk, after which proceeded to the election of town officers and other business as follows:

For Selectmen FRANK I. SPENCER

Voted: That in addition to the state, county and highway taxes prescribed by law, the town raise and appropriate the sum of eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$8,500), which sum shall include the amount necessary to obtain state aid for construction \$2,468, the amount necessary to obtain state aid maintenance \$175, the amount necessary to obtain state aid trunk line maintenance \$2,357, and \$3,500 for all other expenses of the town, including extra highway, town library appropriation, interest, indebtedness and any other expenses of the town.

Voted: To raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars, the same or such part thereof as may be necessary, to be expended for the construction of a snow roller.

Voted: To raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen dollars, the same, or such part thereof as may be necessary, to be expended for the purchase of U. S. flags to decorate the graves of G. A. R. men.

Voted: To raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, to be expended, or such part thereof as may be necessary, under the direction of the selectmen in cooperation with the state and federal agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread

of the disease commonly known as pine blister rust. It being understood that a like amount shall be available from both the state and federal governments.

Voted: To accept the reports of the town officers as printed in the annual report.

Voted: To authorize the selectmen to expend a sum not exceeding thirty dollars in caring for the Greensboro cemetery and the cemetery in the northwesterly part of the town.

Voted: That upon all taxes upon real and personal property paid on or before the 15th day of July, 1918, a discount of five per cent be allowed the taxpayer, and upon all taxes upon real and personal property paid on or before the 15th day of September, 1918, a discount of three per cent be allowed the taxpayer, and that notice be given to all persons having taxes unpaid on October first and that the fee of twenty cents provided by law be added to all such bills.

The following resolution introduced by Prof. Charles F. Emerson, was adopted:

"Hanover, N. H., March 12, 1918

"In recognition of the conscientious and faithful service of Mr. Daniel B. Russell as treasurer of the town for the past twenty-eight years, be it resolved that the town clerk be directed to spread upon the records of the town this testimonial, and also to send a copy of the same to Mr. Russell."

A patriotic paper signed by Governor Henry W. Keyes and also one signed by the Liberty Loan Committee of New England, was read by the moderator. After patriotic remarks by Mr. Horace F. Hoyt, upon motion a committee of three, consisting of Dr. John M. Gile, Horace F. Hoyt and Prof. Harry E. Burton, was appointed by the moderator to draft patriotic resolutions, and the following resolution

was presented by the committee and adopted by the meeting:

"The citizens of Hanover in town meeting assembled, March 12, 1918, do hereby pledge to the Committee of Public Safety of New Hampshire, and to the Liberty Loan committee their hearty cooperation in all activities for the successful prosecution of the war; in the matter of production and conservation and in contributions to the expenses of the war they agree to do all that lies within; and they do hereby express their heartfelt sympathy with the aims and efforts of the national administration."

Accordingly, I hereby declare my unwillingness to accept the office to which I was elected.

This, I understand, is all that I have to do in view of the fact that I have not qualified according to law.





To the inhabitants of the Village Precinct in the town of Hanover, in the county of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in Precinct affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Nugget theatre in said Village on Thursday, the 13th day of March, 1919, at 7:30 o'clock p. m. to vote on the following subjects:

First: To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting, the same to be chosen by ballot.

Second: To choose by ballot a clerk to serve for the term of one year.

Third: To hear the reports of the precinct commissioners, treasurer and auditor, and to pass any votes relating thereto.

Fourth: To choose by ballot, a treasurer and auditor, each to serve for one year, and one precinct commissioner to serve for three years.

Fifth: To raise such sums of money as shall be necesary to defray the expenses of the precinct for the current year, including a police department, fire department, highway department, street lighting department, and all other necessary departments, and to pay the interest on the bonds of the precinct, and to provide for a sinking fund, and to pay outstanding notes.

Sixth: To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

ANNUAL MEETING

Hanover, N. H., March 19, 1918.

Meeting of the legal voters of the Village precinct of Hanover, N. H., called to order by Edwin J. Bartlett, moderator at 7:35 p. m., March 19, 1918.

Voted: That Frank E. Austin be authorized to cast one ballot for A. L. Priddy as clerk pro tem.

The following officers were elected for the year: Moderator—Edwin J. Bartlett. Clerk—A. L. Priddy. Treasurer—Alfred W. Guyer. Auditor—William R. Gray.

Vote by check list for commisioner to serve for three years resulted as follows:

Roland A. Lewin was declared elected.

Art. 3. Voted to accept the various reports as submitted by the precinct commissioners, treasurer and auditor and to place same on file.

Voted: That, upon recommendation of the committee of thirty, the precinct commissioners be requested to omit from their report the long and unclassified lists of assets and of orders drawn, if such can be done without violation of the law.

Art. 5. Voted: That the precinct raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,200, which sum shall include \$3,000 to pay bonds, and the balance of \$4,200 to defray other

expenses of the precinct, as itemized in the budget for 1918-1919, presented by the commissioners.

An amendment substituting \$4,700 for \$7,200 and \$500 for \$3,000 in the above motion was rejected. No, 36. Yes, 23.

Art. 6. Voted: That it be the sense of this meeting that a vote of thanks be extended to Messrs. F. W. and F. F. Davison for the use of the Nugget theatre for meeting purposes.

Voted: That upon all taxes upon personal property and upon real estate paid on or before the fifteenth day of July, 1918, a discount of five per cent be allowed the taxpayer, and that upon all taxes upon personal property and real estate paid on or before the fifteenth day of September, 1918, a discount of three per cent be allowed the taxpayer, and that all persons having unpaid taxes on October first, 1918, be notified, and that twenty cents be added to such bills, as provided by law.

Voted: That the precinct commissioners be and hereby are authorized to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expense of the precinct before the taxes shall be collected and paid into the hands of the treasurer of the precinct.

Voted to adjourn. Adjourned at 8:35 p. m.
