

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants in the town of Hanover in the County of Grafton, in the state of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Trumbell's hall in said Hanover on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing. Also to bring in your ballots for delegates to the Republican and Democratic Presidential conventions under the Australian ballot.
- 2nd. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3rd. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, the same to be expended or such part thereof as may be necessary, under the direction of the selectmen in co-operation with the state and federal agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread of the disease commoney known as pine blister rust. It being understood that a like amount shall be available from both the state and federal governments.

4th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars, the same to be expended for lighting the streets of Etna.

5th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed eight hundred dollars, for the purchase and erection of a suitable memorial for the ex-service men from Hanover and to take such action as may be necessary to arrange for the expenditure of said appropriation.

6th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expense of observing Old Home Week.

7th. To see if the town will vote to reopen the road, on Etna Highlands, so-called, from a point on the east side of said road near the farm of Joseph Perley and running easterly towards the farm formerly owned by C. C. Barden.

8th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty dollars, the same to be expended for flags to decorate soldiers' graves.

9th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may be legally brought before said meeting. Given under our hands and seal this twenty-first day of February in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and twenty.

Voted: That in addition to the State, County, School and Highway taxes required by law the town raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) which sum shall include the amount necessary to obtain state aid for construction \$2,498.50. the amount necessary to obtain state aid maintenance \$550.00, the amount necessary to obtain state aid trunk line maintenance \$1,451.50 and \$5,500 for all other expenses of the town, including extra highway, town library appropriation, interest, indebtedness, and any other expenses of the town.

Voted: That upon all taxes upon real or personal property paid on or before the 15th day of July, 1919, a discount of five percent be allowed the taxpayer, and upon all taxes upon real or personal property paid on or before the 15th day of September, 1919, a discount of three percent be allowed the taxpayer, and that notices be given to all persons having taxes unpaid on October first, and that the fee of twenty cents provided by law be added to all such bills.

To the inhabitants of the Village Precinct in the town of Hanover, in the county of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in Precinct affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Nugget theatre in said Village, on Friday, the 12th day of March, 1920, at 7.30 P. M. o'clock, to vote on the following subjects:

First: To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting, the same to be chosen by ballot.

Second: To choose by ballot a clerk to serve for the term of one year.

Third: To hear the reports of the Precinct Commissioners, treasurer, and auditor, and to pass any votes relating thereto.

Fourth: To choose by ballot, a treasurer and auditor, each to serve one year, and one precinct commissioner to serve for three years.

Fifth: To raise such sums of money as shall be necessary to defray the expenses of the precinct for the current year, including a police department, fire department, highway department, street lighting department, and all other necessary departments, and to pay the interest on the bonds of the precinct, and to provide a sinking fund, and to pay outstanding notes.

Sixth: To raise such sums of money as shall be necessary to take over any existing sidewalks, to construct new sidewalks, or to purchase any new equipment needed for

the construction of sidewalks or roads, or such as may be needed for the upkeep and care of existing sidewalks or highways.

Seventh: To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

ANNUAL MEETING

A meeting of the legal voters of the Village Precinct of Hanover, called in accordance with the foregoing notice, was called to order by E. J. Bartlett, Moderator, at 7.35 p. m.

Horace G. Pender was elected by ballot to serve as Clerk pro tem.

Article 1st. Edwin J. Bartlett was elected by ballot to serve as Moderator for the term of one year.

Article 2nd. Horace G. Pender was elected by ballot to serve as clerk for the term of one year.

Article 3rd. Voted to accept the reports of the Precinct Commissioners, the Treasurer and the Auditor, and that the same be placed on file.

Article 4th. By ballot Alfred W. Guyer was chosen as Treasurer, and W. R. Gray as Auditor, both to serve for the term of one year; and Adna D. Storrs was chosen as Precinct Commissioner, to serve for the term of three years.

Article 5th. Voted that the Precinct raise and appropriate the sum of eight thousand, six hundred dollars (\$8,600.00) to defray the expenses of the Precinct, as itemized in the budget for 1919-1920 as presented by the Commissioners.

Article 6th. Voted that the Precinct Commissioners are hereby authorized to sell the crusher plant if and when they receive an advantageous offer for it.

Voted that the Precinct annul the joint agreement plan, creating a committee of thirty, dissolve the committee, and in its stead the Commissioners of the Precinct be requested to notify the public annually at least ten days before the annual meeting of a hearing at which the Precinct budget and the policy of the Commissioners will be considered and discussed by any citizens interested.

Voted that the Precinct Commissioners be and hereby are directed to formulate a general plan for the systematic construction of sidewalks in the Precinct and to present such plan at a special meeting of the Precinct or at the annual date last named. The general plan shall contain, 1st, specifications as to the materials best adapted to different sections of the Precinct, and their probable cost; 2nd, proposals as to the proportion of the cost of new construction and maintenance which is to be borne by the Precinct and that which is to be assessed against the abutters, which portions may vary according to materials and locality; 3rd, recommendations as to the work to be undertaken first; 4th, a plan for the taking over by the Precinct and the maintenance of sidewalks already constructed by private parties; and 5th, such other proposals as may seem to the Commissioners desirable

Voted, that the Commissioners be and hereby are authorized to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Precinct before the taxes shall be collected and paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the Precinct

Voted, that the thanks of the Precinct be extended to Frank W. Davison for the use of the Nugget theatre for this meeting.

Voted, that upon all taxes upon personal property and upon real estate paid on or before the fifteenth day of July, 1919, a discount of five percent be allowed the taxpayer, and that upon all taxes upon personal property and upon real estate paid on or before the fifteenth day of September, 1919, a discount of three percent be allowed the taxpayer, and that all persons having unpaid taxes on October 1st, 1919, be notified, and that twenty cents be added to such bills, as provided by law.

It was thereupon voted to adjourn, at 8.05 p.m.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Fire Department consists of a Volunteer Company of twenty-five men with apparatus as follows:

1 two ton motor truck equipped with one thousand feet of good, rubber-lined hose, a forty gallon Chemical extinguisher, lanterns, axes, etc.

1 hose cart with about 1000 feet of rubber-lined hose that has been used for some time but is still in good condition, and 500 feet of linen hose.

1 hook and ladder truck carrying one fifty-foot extension ladder, 2 thirty-five-foot extension ladders and one single ladder.

1 hand chemical extinguisher, two Pyrene extinguishers, nozzles, couplings, plaster hooks, axes, etc.

1 Gamewell fire alarm system, complete, with ten boxes and an indicator, an alarm tester, a time recorder and a Universal fire alarm box at telephone station. Also the use of a steam whistle alarm on the college heating plant.
