To the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, in the county of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at Hayes' hall, in said Hanover, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1 To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3 To see if the town will vote to have a liquor agent for the ensuing year.

4 To see what sum of money the town will vote, raise, and appropriate to defray the expenses of observing Old Home Week.

5 To see what action the town will take regarding an additional appropriation for printing the early town records or pass any vote relating thereto.

6 To see what action the town will take in regard to surveying the highways, appropriating any money for the same, or pass any vote relating thereto.

7 To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen, or pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Above account was paid for steel beams for twelve bridges. Two of the larger ones have been placed on the Rudsboro road, leaving ten to be used when found necessary; of these there are the following lengths: two 29 feet; one each 30, 26 1-2, 26, 25, 19, 17, 15 and 13 feet. It was thought to be a good investment to purchase these beams in this quantity thereby getting better rates and the advantage of having them on hand when wanted. It is well known that a bridge sometimes gives out, when to all outward appearance the timbers are sound, but are afterwards found to be decayed inside. In having this assortment of lengths on hand, a bridge can be supplied at once in case of emergency in almost any place in town, thus doing away with temporary repairs while waiting from thirty to sixty days' time in getting the beams from the factory. The town now has seven steel bridges in use, the first cost of these bridges is a little more, but if painted occasionally they will last an unlimited time, the planks last longer on them and the factor of safety is a great item.

ABSTRACT FROM TOWN CLERK'S RECORD

At the annual meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover qualified to vote in town affairs, at the hall of C. W. Hayes, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March, 1903, the following town officers were elected, viz. :

Town Clerk, George M. Bridgman.

Selectmen, Edward P. Storrs, Albert Pinneo, and Don S. Bridgman.

Treasurer, Daniel B. Russell.

Auditors, John H. Foster and John V. Hazen.

Library trustee for three years, Chandler P. Smith.

Highway agents, Edward L. Clifford, Adna P. McPherson, and Ranson S. Cross.

Fence viewers, William D. Chandler, James Spencer, and Frank A. Adams.

Sealer of weights and measures, Luther B. Newell.

Surveyors of wood and lumber, David B. Pelton and Horace L. Huntington.

Board of health, John M. Gile, William L. Barnes and W. G. Spencer. Mr. Barnes afterwards declined to serve on said board of health, and Bert C. Church was appointed by the selectmen as a member of said board in Mr. Barnes' stead.

Voted to raise the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2000) for the general expenses of the town.

Voted to raise the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2000) for the support of schools in addition to the amount required by law.

Voted to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) to help defray the expenses of Old Home Week Association.

Voted to raise the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) for the purpose of copying and printing the original town records from 1761.

Voted to have a liquor agent for ensuing year, the appointment to be left to the selectmen.

Voted to accept and adopt the reports of the town officers, as published in the annual report.

Voted that the town reports be published a week before the town meeting, and a copy be mailed by the selectmen to each voter.

Voted that a discount of five per cent be allowed upon all taxes paid on or before July 15, 1903, and a discount of three per cent upon all taxes paid on or before the 15th day of September, 1903.

BOARD OF EDUCATION, DISTRICT NO. 1

We herewith submit our report upon the work of the Schools of the Village Precinct of Hanover for the spring term of the year 1902-3 and the fall and winter terms of the year 1903-4.

Mr. W. B. Woodbury continues his capable services as Principal of the High School and Miss Cowles as first assistant. The development of the work of the High School with the introduction of the fifth year made necessary a second permanent assistant and Miss Gail G. Smith of the last class at Mount Holyoke was engaged to teach the Natural Sciences and Latin. Her success has been gratifying.

The young men supplied by the Trustees of Moor's Charity School have been Mr. George W. Patch in place of Mr. Carley, to teach Greek, Mr. Franklin Crosse in place of Mr. Moore, to teach Latin and French, and Horace Kidger to teach History.

Their instruction is under the direction of Principal Woodbury and the constant oversight of Mr. F. C. Lewis of the Department of Pedagogy of the College.

Some apparatus and material for teaching Physics, Chemistry, and Biology have been purchased, and necessary books of reference in History and English.

About forty dollars are available for the school library from the proceeds of the lectures upon Local History.

Owing to the introduction of the fifth year into the High School there is to be no class graduating the

coming June. Hereafter the new arrangement will be in full force.

Miss Muzzey transferred the charge of the First Grammar room to the capable hands of Miss Mabel F. Jones, while Miss Bickford in the Second Grammar, Miss Applebee in the Second Primary, and Miss Roe in the First Primary are tried teachers giving great satisfaction.

The school building is increasingly used for the social life of the school.

The continued addition to the sum received for tuition from pupils outside the district indicate that the work of the school is being appreciated.
