

To the inhabitants in the town of Hanover in the County of Grafton, in the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Nugget Theatre in said Hanover on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First: To choose by ballot a clerk to serve for one year.

Second: To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors and other town officers and committees and pass any vote relating thereto.

A Prosecuting Agent to prosecute violations of the Liquor Laws and any other necessary town officers.

Fourth: To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Fifth: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars for the benefit of the Etna Fire Association.

Sixth: To hear a report of the Municipal Building Committee.

Seventh: To see if the town will vote to make subject to gates and bars that part of the Wolfeboro Road, so-called, easterly of the Three Mile Road near the residence of H. Guyer and westerly of the Conroy place near Tunis. The exact location within the above limits to be designated by the Selectmen.

Eighth: To transact any other business that legally may be brought before said meeting.

Ninth: To choose two delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

ABSTRACTS FROM TOWN CLERK'S RECORD

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover at the Nugget Theatre in said town on Tuesday the 12th day of March, 1929, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, the meeting was called to order by Harry E. Burton, Moderator, after the reading of the warrant by the clerk proceeded to the election of town officers and other business as follows:

Upon Motion:

Voted:

That William H. Murray cast one vote for George M. Bridgman for Town Clerk, and the said George M. Bridgman having all the votes cast, was by the Moderator declared elected Town Clerk and in open meeting took the oath of office as prescribed by law.

Second Article in the Warrant:

Voted:

That the Town Report as printed, including the reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors and other town officers be accepted.

Third Article:

To choose by ballot to serve for three years:

One Selectman
One Library Trustee
One Trustee of Trust Funds

For Selectman:

Voted:

That the Town Clerk cast one vote for Carl C. Ward for Selectman and the said Carl C. Ward was by the Moderator declared elected Selectman for three years.

For Library Trustee:

Voted:

That the Town Clerk cast one vote for Robert Fletcher for Library Trustee and the said Robert Fletcher was by the Moderator declared elected Library Trustee.

For Trustee of Trust Funds:

Voted:

That the Town Clerk cast one vote for Halsey C. Edgerton for Trustee of Trust Funds which was done and the said Halsey C. Edgerton having all of the votes cast, was by the Moderator declared elected Trustee of Funds.

To serve for one year:

One Treasurer Two Auditors Three Fence Viewers

For Treasurer:

Voted:

That the Town Clerk cast one vote for Alfred W. Guyer for Treasurer, which was done and the said Alfred W. Guyer having all of the votes given in was by the Moderator declared elected Treasurer.

For Auditors:

Voted:

That the Town Clerk cast one vote for Halsey C. Edgerton and Archie M. Peisch which was done and the said Halsey C. Edgerton and Archie M. Peisch having all the votes given in were by the Moderator declared elected Auditors.

For Fence Viewers:

Voted:

That the Town Clerk cast one vote for James Spencer, Daniel O. Hoyt and Irving P. Fitts for Fence Viewers which was done and James Spencer, Daniel O. Hoyt and Irving P. Fitts having all of the votes given in were by the Moderator declared elected as Fence Viewers.

For Prosecuting Agent to Prosecute Violations of the Liquor Laws:

A ballot was called for with the following result: Charles M. Tesreau had 17 votes; Harold R. Bruce had 70 votes; and the said Harold R. Bruce having a majority of all the votes given in was by the Moderator declared elected as Prosecuting Agent.

Article 4—Upon Motion:

Voted:

That in addition to the State, County, Highway and regular Poll Taxes provided by law, the town raise the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars and appropriate said sum and all other moneys which may be paid into the treasury, and which are not required by law otherwise to be expended in accordance with the budget and report as presented by the Selectmen.

Voted:

That authority is hereby granted the Selectmen to borrow on notes issued for not over one year an amount not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in addition to what has been raised otherwise.

Article 5:

Voted:

To raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars for the benefit of the Etna Fire Association.

Article 6—Report of Building Committee:

March 12, 1929

In accordance with the vote at the last meeting, a Municipal Building Committee consisting of Adelbert Ames,

Jr., Harvey N. Camp, Alfred W. Guyer, Adna D. Storrs and Francis J. A. Neef Chairman was appointed on March 29, 1928. This committee immediately proceeded to carry out the instructions of the Town in general conformity with the plans submitted by the previous committee on a Municipal Building.

The Service Building on the site chosen and purchased by the Selectmen is nearing completion and will be ready for occupancy on May 1. Instead of presenting a detailed description your committee invites those interested to inspect the building at the close of this meeting. It is sufficiently advanced in construction, so that a fairly complete picture of the ultimate appearance of the interior may be gained at this time.

The cost of the project will be approximately as follows:

Site purchased by Selectmen,	\$27,500.00
Municipal Building, including heating,	
plumbing and architects' fees, electric

sidewalks and drive; equipment and

Municipal apartments; moving and re-

Total,	\$89,383.65

This total is about \$9,000.00 in excess of the appropriation of \$80,000.00 voted at the last meeting. In the estimates of the previous Municipal Building Committee, upon which the vote of the town was based, approximately \$50,000.00 was allowed for the building, \$10,000.00 for equipment, etc. and \$20,000.00 for the site. When the plans were completed and bids received it was evident that the original estimates for the Municipal Building for equipment, etc., and for the moving and remodeling of the old Episcopal Rectory could

not be reduced, but would remain as figured, namely about \$60,000.00.

Inasmuch as the Selectmen were obliged to pay \$27,500.00, that is \$7,500 more than the amount allowed in the original estimate for a satisfactory site, it was therefore obvious that the project could not be completed within the appropriation of \$80,000.00.

Your Committee, therefore, consulted with voters of the town and the opinion was unanimous that it would be unwise to postpone the construction of the Municipal Service Building and that the Committee, in view of the favorable bids, should proceed immediately with the projected plans. In fact a group of public-spirited citizens offered to guarantee the excess until such a time that the town would appropriate the necessary funds.

Your committee wishes to draw attention to the fact that the old Episcopal Rectory was not only moved to the new site but was also completely remodeled into a two-family apartment house consisting of one five-room and one eight-room tenement. The plumbing has been renovated entirely and a new heating plant installed.

Your committee welcomes any inquiries concerning matters of detail which may be of interest to the voters of the town. In order to bring this matter formally before the meeting for discussion, the committee offers the following motion:

Voted:

That for the purpose of raising money to complete the construction and equipment of the Hanover Municipal Building and Apartments, and for other expenses in connection therewith, the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Hanover, N. H., be, and they are authorized to borrow, in addition to the sum of eighty thousand (\$80,000) Dollars already authorized, the sum of nine thousand (\$9,000) Dollars, or such part thereof as in their judgment may be necessary, on notes or bonds of the Town of Hanover,

N. H., and to execute any documents in connection therewith; full discretion as to fixing the time and place of payment and the rate of interest of said securities and any other details in connection therewith is hereby delegated to the said Board of Selectmen.

A vote being taken upon the foregoing motion, it was decided in the affirmative.

Upon Motion:

Voted:

That the Selectmen of the Town of Hanover, N. H., be, and they are hereby authorized to sell to the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., the tract of land with the buildings thereon, situated on South Main Street and owned by the Town of Hanover, N. H., for an amount of money which will be sufficient to discharge all obligations which at the time of sale the said Town of Hanover has incurred for such tract of land and buildings. The buildings referred to are known as the Hanover Municipal Building and Apartments. The Selectmen are authorized to execute any and all documents necessary in connection therewith.

Upon Motion:

Voted:

That the Selectmen of the Town of Hanover, N. H., be empowered to lease the whole or any part of Hanover Municipal Building and Apartments on such terms as the Selectmen may deem advisable.

Upon Motion:

Voted:

To raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Dollars for the benefit of the Town Library.

Upon Motion:

Voted:

That the Selectmen be authorized to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet the Town's obliga-

tions until the taxes have been collected and paid into the Treasury.

Upon Motion:

Voted:

To pass over the ninth article in the warrant.

Upon Motion:

Voted:

That upon all taxes upon real and personal property a discount of five per cent be allowed the taxpayer if paid on or before July 15th, 1929 and a discount of two percent be allowed the taxpayer if paid on or before October 15, 1929.

Books bought by the treasurer number about 132. By request of the teachers of the town schools and arrangement with the librarian, thirty books,—more or less,—were selected especially for use in prescribed courses of reading by pupils of the various grades. In general a considerable proportion of all the books purchased have been chosen in the interest of the young folks. In fact this proportion has been increasing during several preceding years. From the readers in general, whether older or younger, the demand for fiction prevails, rather than for the more instructive and matter-of-fact quality of literature. The greater part of the mass of books now offered to,—indeed almost thrown at,—the public

has so little worth as literature,—being not only trashy but often very much worse, that the task of sifting and choosing what is wholesome and self-improving is not easy.

Right here the trustees have been favored by the advice and active cooperation of Miss Kingsland, librarian of the Howe library. Her experience and knowledge of books have afforded welcome aid in choosing that which is suitable, either for entertainment or instruction; at the same time having regard to getting the most and the best from the limited funds which the voters allow us. A system of loans of books in small lots from the Howe library to readers in Hanover Center indicates what is possible as an extension of the facilities offered by said library for the benefit of more distant readers.

Attention should be called to the periodicals received by the library. The Hanover Gazette, of course, has interest only week by week. The National Republic Monthly has been reported as merely placed on file. But its value should be recognized by both old and young as a medium of instruction in American History and Biography, a promoter of love of country, and as presenting the romance and hard facts in the development of these United States. Really it should be in every family, as a means of making better Americans. It is published in Washington, D. C., by those in close contact with the departments of our national government. St. Nicholas magazine and Child Life serve the young people especially. To these have been added lately the weekly Literary Digest, requested by the teachers as an aid to pupils in making reports on current events. Finally the American Nature Magazine, also published in Washington, a monthly which gives authoritative instruction and information for old and young about the world of Nature out of doors. This is made more to the purpose by a wealth of high class illustrations.

After faithful service of nineteen years Mrs. Nettie J. Praddex retired as librarian. We may recall right here that the library building was completed in 1906 at a total cost of about \$4,000. It was built from the proceeds of the sale of

the town farm to the Hanover Water Works Co., for the sum of \$4,500. The balance of about \$500 was held as a fund for maintenance. Mr. Thos. W. Praddex served as librarian to and including 1910. Mrs. Praddex has been in charge until October, 1929. It is noteworthy that the construction of the building was so thoroughly done, under close supervision, that repairs have been quite negligible, probably within \$100 altogether.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants in the Village Precinct in the Town of Hanover, in the County of Grafton, in the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Precinct affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet in the Nugget Theatre, in said Village, on Tuesday, March 13, 1930, at 8.30 P. M. o'clock, to act on the following subjects:—

First: To choose by ballot a Moderator to preside over said meeting.

Second: To choose by ballot a Clerk for the term of one year.

Third: To hear the reports of the Precinct Commissioners, Treasurer, and Auditor and pass any vote relating thereto.

Fourth: To choose by ballot a Treasurer and Auditor, each to serve for one year and one Precinct Commissioner to serve for three years.

Fifth: To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray Precinct expenses for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Sixth: To see if the Precinct will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of constructing highways within the Precinct taking advantage in so far as possible of joining with the State in so-called State aid highway construction.

Seventh: To hear a report of the Committee of five appointed by the Commissioners to study the relations between

the Town and the Precinct with reference to the possibility of effecting economies and improvements in organizations either by consolidation of the Town and Precinct or by other means, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Eighth: To see if the Precinct will adopt the following act approved by the Legislature March 27, 1929:

Powers Granted. Amend section 3 of Chapter 225 of the Laws of 1901 by inserting after the words "police officers" in the ninth line of said section the following; and all the powers granted to towns under sections 48 to 68 inclusive, of Chapter 42 of the Public laws, so that section as amended shall read as follows: Sect. 3. The said precinct shall have all the rights and be subject to all the liabilities now belonging to Village districts under chapter 57 of the Public Laws, including the extinguishment of fires, the lighting and sprinkling of streets, the planting and caring for shade and ornamental trees, the supply of water for domestic and fire purposes, main drains or common sewers, and the appointing and employing of watchmen and police officers, and all the powers granted to towns under sections 48 to 68 inclusive of chapter 42 of the Public Laws, and the said Precinct shall have all the powers in relation to these objects that towns have or may have in relation to like objects, and all that are necessary for the accomplishment of its purposes;"

and if said act is adopted to pass any vote relating thereto.

Ninth: To see if the Precinct will adopt the provisions of Section 1 to 9 inclusive of Chapter 163 of the Public Laws relating to inspectors of milk and licensing dealers.

Tenth: To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Hanover, N. H. March 14, 1929.

A meeting of the voters of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., was called to order by Frank A. Musgrove at 8:30 o'clock P. M. The Warrant was read by the Clerk.

Article I. Frank A. Musgrove was elected Moderator to preside over the meeting.

Article II. Ira W. Leavitt was elected Clerk for the term of one year.

Article III. The Precinct Commissioners, Treasurer and Auditor presented their reports for the year ending January 31, 1929, as printed with the following corrections on pages 14 and 15 of the Precinct Commissioners' report.

Summary of Receipts

Item marked miscellaneous be increased by \$107.00 so that it shall read \$686.79, which will make the next total read \$11,439.00, the next total Current Revenue, \$47,611.64 and the grand total shall read \$56,948.27.

On Page 15, Summary of Disbursements

Item Maintenance be decreased by \$921.50 so that the item shall read \$17,684.30, the total for Current Revenue shall then read \$33,332.30 and the grand total \$56,447.75.

Also, the Commissioners desire to report that the Precinct property located at the corner of Allen and Main Streets has been sold in accordance with the vote of the last Precinct meeting. The sale has been made to Mr. George Gitsis of Hanover, N. H., for \$40,100.00 which was the highest bid received for this property.

The Commissioners also report that they applied to the New Hampshire State Legislature to have the debt limit of the Precinct increased to three (3) per cent of its valuation. This power has been conferred on the Precinct by the act entitled "An Act Relating To The Powers of The Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H.," dated March 7, 1929.

The Commissioners have applied to the Legislature for a bill authorizing the Precinct to have the same authority in regard to the zoning that is given to Towns and Cities. This act has passed the House and is on its way through the Senate, but has not yet been made a Law.

Voted: To accept the reports of the Precinct Commissioners, Treasurer and Auditor as printed in the Town Report of 1929 with the amendments already presented at this meeting and to place the same on file.

Article IV. Alfred W. Guyer was elected Treasurer for the term of one year. Clarence W. Cofran was elected Auditor for the term of one year. Max A. Norton was elected Precinct Commissioner for the term of three (3) years. Harry A. Wells was elected Precinct Commissioner for the term of two (2) years.

Article V. Voted: That the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty-Two Thousand Five Hundred (32,500.00) Dollars to defray the expenses of the Precinct for the current year ending January 31, 1930, according to the items set forth in the budget.

Article VI. Voted: The Commissioners of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., are hereby authorized to purchase from the Town of Hanover, N. H., the tract of land situated on South Main Street with the buildings thereon at such time as the construction and equipment of such buildings is completed. The buildings referred to are known as the Municipal Building and Apartments. That for the purpose of raising money for the purchase authorized above, the Commissioners of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., be and they are hereby authorized to borrow the sum of Ninety Thousand (90,000.00) Dollars or such part thereof as in their judgment may be necessary on the notes or bonds of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., and to execute any documents in connection therewith: full discretion as to fixing the time and place of payment and the rate of interest of said securities and any other details in connection therewith is hereby delegated to the said Commissioners of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H.

Voted: That the Commissioners of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., be empowered to lease the whole or any part of the Hanover Municipal Building and Apartments on such terms as the Commissioner may deem advisable.

Article VII. Voted: That the attention of the Commissioners of the Precinct is called to the urgent need of prompt attention to the rebuilding of the old culvert, now nearly choked by mud and tree roots, on East Wheelock Street in the hollow of what is also known as Balch Hill Road.

Voted: That the Commissioners be requested to appoint a Committee of five (5) to study the relations between the Town and the Precinct with reference to the possibility of effecting economies and improvements in organizations either by consolidation of the Town and Precinct or by other means; this Committee to prepare a report for publication not later than February 1, 1930, the understanding being that this Committee shall hold public hearings and by other means ensure that full consideration be given to the interests of those living outside as well as within the present Precinct limits.

Voted: To authorize the Precinct Commissioners to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Precinct before the taxes are raised and paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the Precinct.

Voted: That upon all taxes on personal property and upon real estate paid on or before the 15th day of July, 1929, a discount of five (5) per cent be allowed the taxpayer, and that upon all taxes on personal property and real estate paid on or before the 15th day of October, 1929, a discount of two (2) per cent be allowed the taxpayer.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 10.37 o'clock.
