To the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, in the county of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at Hayes' hall, in said Hanover, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to have a liquor agent for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for defraying the expenses of Old Home Week association for the ensuing year.
- 6. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations proposed by the Constitutional convention shall be approved.
- 7. To see what action the town will take in relation to copying and preparing for printing the early town records, and providing any appropriation therefor, or passing any vote relating thereto.
- 8. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

BOARD OF EDUCATION DISTRICT NO. 1

We herewith submit our report upon the work of the schools of the Village Precinct for the spring term of the year 1901–1902 and the fall and winter terms of the year 1902–1903.

After three years of efficient service Principal Edgar A. Kaharl resigned at the close of the last school year, to accept a position in the Portland, Me., High School.

His place has been filled to our great satisfaction by Mr. W. B. Woodbury, a graduate of Bowdoin College in the class of 1900, who came to us after two years of successful experience as a teacher.

Miss Flint's resignation made necessary the choice of a new first assistant for the High School—and Miss Frances G. Cowles, who graduated in the last class at Mount Holyoke College, has taken up the work in English and French with enthusiasm and skill.

The arrangement with the trustees of the Moor's Charity School for further teaching in the High School has been again modified, to the advantage of the district, so that three graduate teachers are furnished this year. Each teaches the special subject which he is pursuing in the Graduate Department of Pedagogy, and it is believed that the quality of teaching thus afforded is of a grade rarely secured in a High School course. Succeeding Mr. Gentleman and Mr. Mason, Mr. Neale S. Carley teaches Greek and Greek History, Mr. Herman W. Farwell takes Science and part of the Mathematics, while Mr. Frank C. Moore has the classes in Latin and in Roman History. We are glad to acknowledge the zeal and fidelity of the men sent by the college to assist in building up a High School worthy of the town of Hanover.

The new five years' course is now in full operation so that we are able to meet the requirements of the college and thus enter our graduates upon certificate. It is pleasant not to be obliged to note any changes in the teaching force in the Grammar and Primary Schools. Strong and tried teachers are in every position.

Miss Muzzey has been asked to take charge of vocal music in the schools. A marked improvement is already noticeable in this neglected feature of our curriculum. A series of school sociables indicates further that the school is coming to mean what it should in the life of the community.

With the present winter term Miss Florence Currier took charge of the work in Drawing. The school is fortunate in having available so finely trained a teacher in this important subject.
