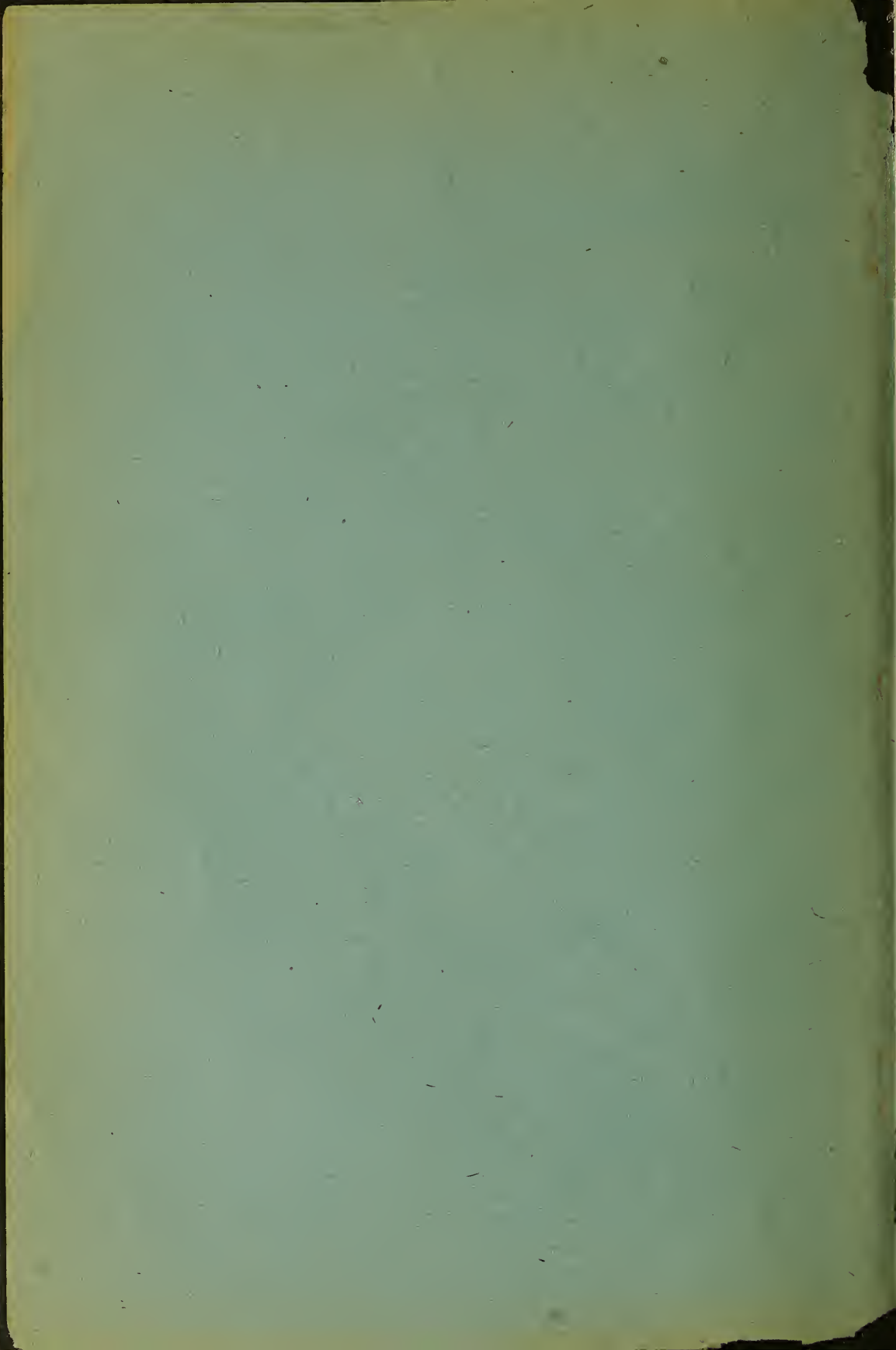

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants in the town of Hanover in the County of Grafton, in the state of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Trumbell's hall in said Hanover on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2nd. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3rd. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, the same to be expended or such part thereof as may be necessary, under the direction of the selectmen in cooperation with the state and federal agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread of the disease commonly known as pine blister rust. It being understood that a like amount shall be available from both the state and federal governments.

4th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expenses of observing Old Home Week.

5th. To bring in your ballots upon each of the questions submitted by the Convention to Revise the Constitution relative to the amendments proposed by said Convention at a session held on January 28, 1921.

6th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum twenty dollars, the same to be expended for flags to decorate soldiers' graves.

7th. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a portion of the highway known as Webster Avenue for the purpose of widening and straightening said highway, provided that land for such purpose is supplied without cost to the town, and to authorize the selectmen to take any action necessary to put this vote into effect.

8th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may be legally brought before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal this nineteenth day of February in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and twenty one.

EXPLANATION REGARDING STATISTICS

The following statistics include the births and deaths occurring in the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital during 1920, which do not properly belong to the town. Forty-eight were children born there of mothers from other towns, and forty-five persons from other towns died there. Taking these from the numbers given in the tables, the record for Hanover would be forty-eight births and thirty-two deaths.

Voted: That in addition to the state, county and highway taxes prescribed by law, the town raise and appropriate the sum of nine thousand five hundred dollars (\$9,500), which sum shall include the amount necessary to obtain state and trunk line maintenance \$385, the amount necessary to obtain state and trunk line maintenance \$4,000, and \$2,600, for all other expenses of the town, including extra highway, town library appropriation, interest, indebtedness and any other expenses of the town.

Voted: To raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, the same to be expended, or such part as may be necessary, under the direction of the Selectmen in co-operation with the State and Federal agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread of the disease commonly known as pine blister rust, it being understood that a like amount shall be available from both State and Federal governments.

Voted: To raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars, the same to be expended for lighting the streets of Etna.

Voted: That the town raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for the purchase and erection of a suitable memorial for the ex-service men

from Hanover, and that the selectmen be directed to appoint a committee of three (3), on which there shall be a representative of ex-service men to select and erect such a memorial within the limit named, or to make recommendation for a larger expenditure if the committee consider that desirable.

Voted: To pass over the sixth article of the warrant.

Voted: To reopen the road on Etna Highlands, so called, from a point on the east side of said road near the farm of Joseph Perley and running easterly towards the farm formerly owned by C. C. Barden.

Voted: To raise and appropriate the sum of twenty dollars, the same to be expended for flags to decorate soldiers' graves.

Voted: That upon all taxes upon real or personal property paid on or before the 15th day of July, 1920, a discount of five per cent be allowed the taxpayer, and upon all taxes upon real or personal property paid on or before the 15th day of September, 1920, a discount of three percent be allowed the taxpayer, and that notice be given to all persons having taxes unpaid on October first, and that the fee of twenty cents provided by law be added to all such bills.

Voted: To accept the reports of the town officers as printed in the Annual Report.

Voted: To adjourn.

At the Biennial election in the town of Hanover, November 2, 1920, at nine o'clock in the forenoon:—

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Fire Department consists of a Volunteer Company of twenty-five men with apparatus as follows:

1 two-ton motor truck equipped with one thousand feet of good, rubber-lined hose, a forty gallon Chemical extinguisher, lanterns, axes, etc.

1 hose cart with about 1000 feet of rubber-lined hose that has been used for some time but is still in good condition, and 500 feet of linen hose.

1 hook and ladder truck carrying one fifty-foot extension ladder, 2 thirty-five-foot extension ladders and one single ladder.

1 hand chemical extinguisher, two Pyrene extinguishers, nozzles, couplings, plaster hooks, axes, etc.

1 Gamewell fire alarm system, complete, with ten boxes and an indicator, an alarm tester, a time recorder and a Universal fire alarm box at telephone station. Also the use of a steam whistle alarm on the college heating plant.
