THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hanover, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at Hayes' hall in said Hanover, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1 To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3 To see if the town will vote to have a liquor agent for the ensuing year.

4 To see what sum of money the town will vote, raise and appropriate to defray the expenses of observing Old Home Week.

5 To see if the town will vote to discontinue that portion of the highway leading northerly from the buildings owned or occupied by William Wardrobe to the highway passing by the buildings owned or occupied by Mrs. Emma Aldrich.

6 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to be expended as follows: One hundred and twenty-five dollars for the purpose of lighting the street lights in the village of Hanover and seventy-five dollars for

the purpose of lighting the street lights in the village of Etna in said town.

7 To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen, or pass any vote relating thereto and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ABSTRACT FROM TOWN CLERK'S RECORD

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover qualified to vote in town affairs, on the second Tuesday of March, 1906, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, the meeting was called to order by Hamilton T. Howe, the moderator. The warrant under which the meeting was called was read by the town clerk, after which proceeded to the choice of town officers, as follows :

Town clerk, George M. Bridgman.

Selectmen, Edward P. Storrs, Albert Pinneo, and Don S. Bridgman.

Treasurer, Daniel B. Russell.

Highway agents, Edward L. Clifford, Adna P. McPherson, and Ransom S. Cross.

Auditors, John V. Hazen and John H. Foster.

Library trustee, Robert Fletcher.

Fence viewers, James Spencer, Frank A. Adams, and Willie G. Spencer.

Sealer of weights and measures, Luther B. Newell.

Surveyors of wood and lumber, David B. Pelton, Horace L. Huntington.

Prosecuting agent to prosecute violations of the liquor law, Arthur P. Fairfield.

Voted to instruct the selectmen to appoint a liquor agent, said agent to be a person not employed in mercantile business.

Voted to raise the sum of fourteen hundred dollars for the general expenses of the town.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars to help defray the expenses of Old Home Week.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for permanent improvements of highways.

Voted to accept the reports of the town officers as published in the town report.

Voted to instruct the selectmen to appropriate money for the purpose of grading around the town library building out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Voted to discontinue that portion of the Rope Ferry road, so called, which lies north of the residence of Charles Kibbie.

Voted to raise the sum of twenty-five dollars for the purpose of repairing the highway leading from the residence of J. B. Dana to the terminus of the highway near the old Woodward place on Moose mountain, same to be expended under the direction of F. B. Camp.

Voted to raise the sum of twelve hundred dollars for the support of schools, in excess of the amount required by law.

The usual discount was voted upon taxes paid on or before the 15th of July and the 15th day of September, 1906.

At the biennial election in the town of Hanover on the 6th day of November, 1906, the following named officers were chosen, viz.:

Moderator for two years, Edwin J. Bartlett.

For representatives to the general court, Irving P. Fitts, Frank A. Musgrove.

For supervisors of the check list, Charles F. Emerson, Carlton N. Camp, and George M. Bridgman.

BOARD OF EDUCATION, DISTRICT NO. 1

We herewith submit our annual report upon the work of the schools of the Village Precinct of Hanover. This report is for the calendar year Jan. 1, 1906, to Jan. 1, 1907.

With the exception of the Principal of the High School there has been no change in the force of regular teachers during the year. This continuity of service contributes more than anything else to the smooth and efficient running of the school and is always a matter for congratulation.

In the Second Primary room the number of pupils has become this year too large for efficient handling and Mrs. A. L. Kibling has been engaged to assist Miss Applebee part of each day in personal instruction of pupils that needed individual care.

Principal W. B. Woodbury left us at the end of the last school year to accept a position elsewhere. He had given the school four years of efficient and devoted service and we parted with him with regret.

As his successor your Board fortunately secured a graduate of Dartmouth College, of the year 1897, Mr. Franklin E. Heald, an experienced and successful teacher.

Miss Cowles as first assistant and Miss Smith as second assistant continued their invaluable services.

The teachers from the College, furnished in accordance with the existing arrangement, are men of unusual

excellence—Mr. George W. Putnam in Latin, Mr. Randall Cooke in Greek, and Mr. Robert I. Adriance in History. Miss A. A. Estabrook has been engaged to teach Music in the grades, and it is hoped that instruction in this important subject can be permanently provided for.

By a re-arrangement of studies an additional year in French has been provided for to meet the requirements of the girls' colleges, also a fuller course in Civics and the Constitution of New Hampshire.

At an expense of several hundred dollars suitable tables, sinks, etc., have been put in for modern laboratory instruction in Chemistry.

It will be necessary to add to the equipment in Physics in a similar way during the present year.
