One of the best kept secrets in Hanover is the Hanover Town Library, locally known as the Etna Library. The Hanover Town Library was first established as the official public library in 1898, and the present building was erected in 1906.

How many times have you driven by the library on the Two-Mile Road and thought, "I've never been in there"? Admittedly, the library's hours are limited: Tuesdays from 3:30 to 8:30 p.m. and Thursdays from 9 to noon and then 7 to 9 p.m.

But wouldn't it be worth the effort to discover a new source of recreational reading? Are you number 10 on the waiting list for the latest best seller? It's probably on the "new books" shelf at the Hanover Town Library.

After school on Tuesday is a great time to browse through the children's section. Storytime for preschoolers and kindergarteners, ages 3 to 6, is held every other Thursday at 10 a.m. Pick up a storytime schedule or check the Valley News Calendar for dates.

Turn left off of Trescott Road — the Hanover Town Library is located on the left-hand side of the Two-Mile Road, just around the curve from the Etna Post Office and directly across from King Hill Road.
