

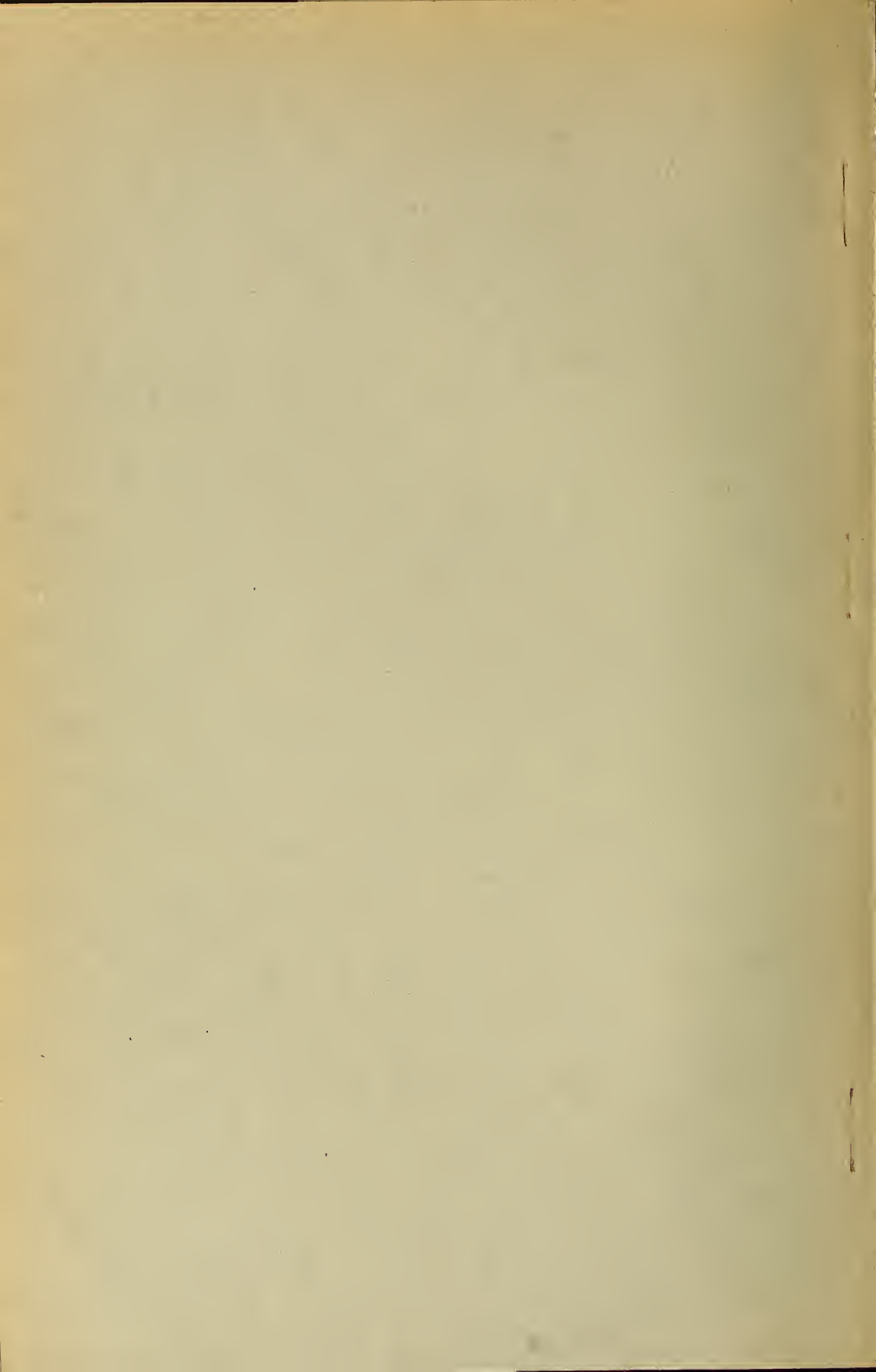

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants in the town of Hanover in the County of Grafton, in the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Nugget Theatre in said Hanover on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First: To choose by ballot a clerk to serve for one year.

Second: To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors and other town officers and committees and pass any vote relating thereto.

Third: To choose by ballot

*To serve for three years*

One Selectman  
One Library Trustee  
One Trustee of Trust Funds

*To serve for one year*

One Treasurer  
Two Auditors  
Three Fence Viewers  
Two Surveyors of Wood and Lumber  
A Prosecuting Agent to prosecute violations of the Liquor Laws and any other necessary town officers.

Fourth: To raise Such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Fifth: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars for the benefit of the Etna Fire Association.

Sixth: To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell at public or private sale, any or all property bought by the town for taxes.

Seventh: To see if the town will vote to make subject to gates and bars the following highways:

That portion, which has not previously been thrown up, of the highway laid out June 27, 1817, leading easterly from a point a little northerly of the house of Elmer Dana and lying between the highway past the residences of F. P. Lynch and Elmer Dana to the Arvin School House and the highway past the R. S. Cross farm to the Goss Neighborhood.

The Cory Road, so called, being all of the highway running in a generally northerly direction from the highway leading past Dennis LaCoss's to the Arvin School House at a point near the Arvin School House to the highway running easterly from Hanover Center to Moose Mt., at a point near the George LaBombard Estate.

That portion of the Wardrobe Road, so called, between a point fifty feet northerly of the intersection of the prolongation of the northerly end of the Wardrobe house and said road, to the Lyme Road leading past the R. Rennie and George Woodward farms.

That portion of Lover's Lane, so called between a point one hundred feet westerly of the intersection of the prolongation of the westerly end of the site of the Harley Cummings house and said Lover's Lane to the River Road leading past the Field and Leslie B. Morse farms.

That portion of a road leading westerly from a point a short distance northerly from the W. H. Jones farm on a highway leading past the W. H. Jones and Uel Spencer farms, to a point in said road in the prolongation of the easterly end of the sheds attached to the house on the Fay Place.

That part of the Wolfeboro Road leading from the Perley farm now owned by Ludvig Kuhre westerly to the point of its



junction, near the residence of David Croall, with the highway leading from John Humiston's to the Reservoir.

That part of the road running northerly from its junction with the Wolfeboro road near the Tunis School House, to a point about 200 feet southerly of the buildings of R. K. Adams.

The road which branches from the highway, a few rods north of the buildings on the Uel Spencer farm, so-called, and runs down the hill in a northerly direction to a point where it joins the State road, from Hanover to Lyme, near the buildings formerly owned by Chandler P. Smith.

Eighth: To see if the Town will vote to join with the Precinct and School District in establishing a Hanover Finance Committee.

Ninth: To see if the Town of Hanover, New Hampshire, will vote to raise and appropriate money to supplement the Services rendered by The Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital through the Town of Hanover free beds.

Tenth: To see if the Town will take any action with reference to the regulation of the observance of Sunday in accordance with the authorization given by Chapter 155 of the Laws of the State of New Hampshire, passed at the Session of 1931.

Eleventh: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the holding of boxing bouts in Hanover as provided in the New Hampshire laws of 1929, Chapter 132, Section 13.

Twelfth: To bring in your votes for the Election of Delegates at Large, Alternate Delegates at Large, Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Conventions of the various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

Thirteenth: To transact any other business that legally may be brought before said meeting.

## ABSTRACT FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S RECORD

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, qualified to vote in town affairs, on Tuesday the tenth day of March 1931, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, the meeting was called to order by Harry E. Burton, the Moderator. After the reading of the warrant proceeded to the election of town officers and other business as follows:

George M. Bridgman was elected Town Clerk. Voted: That the Town Report as printed including the reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors, and other town officers be accepted.

Andrew B. Elder was duly elected as Selectman for three years.

Adna L. Camp was elected Library Trustee for three years.

John A. Humiston was elected Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

Alfred W. Guyer was duly elected as Treasurer for one year.

Halsey C. Edgerton and Archie M. Peisch were elected Auditors for one year.

James Spencer, Daniel O. Hoyt and Irving P. Fitts were elected Fence Viewers for one year.

John A. Humiston and William H. Hart were elected as Surveyors of Wood and Lumber for one year.

Arthur P. Fairfield was duly elected as Prosecuting Agent for one year.

*Voted:*

That in addition to the State, County, Highway and regular Poll Taxes provided by law the town raise the sum of thirty-one thousand two hundred and forty dollars and

appropriate said sum and all other moneys which may be paid into the treasury, and which are not required by law otherwise to be expended, in accordance with the budget and report as presented by the Selectmen.

*Voted:*

That authority be granted the Selectmen to borrow on notes issued for not over one year an amount not to exceed five thousand (\$5,000) dollars in addition to what has been raised otherwise.

*Voted:*

To raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars for the benefit of the Etna Fire Association.

*Voted:*

It is the sense of this meeting the Town should participate in the financing of highway construction recently completed within the Village Precinct of Hanover to the extent of \$17,000 to be appropriated for this purpose over a period of three years.

*Voted:*

That the sum of \$5,000 be raised and paid to the Village Precinct of Hanover in the year 1931 for the purpose of participating in the financing of highway construction recently completed within the Village Precinct.

*Moved:*

That the Town of Hanover raise the sum of one thousand dollars and pay the same to the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital to reimburse the hospital in part for the care and nursing of patients residing in Hanover who are unable to pay their own bills.

*Voted:*

To discontinue as an open highway and make subject to gates and bars that portion of Rope Ferry Road northerly of a point which is about 150 feet northerly of the intersection of the westerly side of Rope Ferry Road and the southerly side of Hiltonfield Lane.

*Voted:*

That such portion of the property of Dartmouth College as cannot be exempted from taxation under Sections 22 and 24 of Chapter 60 of the New Hampshire Public Laws shall, until otherwise provided by vote in town meeting, be treated as not included in the eight hundred thousand (\$800,000) dollars on which Dartmouth College is paying tax in accordance with the vote of the town passed March 9, 1915.

*Voted:*

That an Advisory Board of three members be elected to act with the Selectmen in the assessment of real estate until such time as the Advisory Board shall be discontinued by vote in town meeting, one member of the board to hold office for three years, one for two years, one for one year, and thereafter at every annual meeting one member shall be chosen to hold office for three years. Vacancies in said Board shall be filled by appointment by the Selectmen, such appointee shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the town.

*Voted:*

To elect as members of the Advisory Board to act with the Selectmen in the assessment of real estate, Edgar H. Hunter for three years, Archie B. Gile for two years, Thomas E. Ward for one year.

*Voted:*

That the Selectmen be authorized to borrow such sums

of money as may be necessary to meet the town's obligations until the taxes are collected and paid into the treasury.

*Voted:*

That upon all taxes upon real and personal property a discount of three percent be allowed the tax payers if paid on or before July 15, 1931.

After twenty-five years of use with very little deterioration the library building received its first general re-varnishing and painting. The latter item related chiefly to the portico as there is but little other woodwork exposed outside. The interior finish, which has almost the fine quality of cabinet work, showed the need of renovation, especially around the window-casings where exposed to the hot sunshine of summer.

The need for more adequate lighting through the afternoons of late autumn and the winter season, had become so great, that the trustees felt called upon to equip the building permanently with a system of electric lights. A light of sufficient power is set in

each corner, and a central light over the center table and desk. The amount of current used incurs only the minimum charge of one dollar per month. This improvement makes it possible for visitors to linger in the library, even into twilight hours, and become better acquainted with the books.

Again acknowledgment is due to the librarian and assistants of the Howe Library for advice in the selection of books and typing cards for the card catalogue. The clerical work of keeping the card catalogue up to date cannot be done for the town library in the time at command of the librarian. An increase in the appropriation is needed for perfecting the classification and arrangement of the books, so that the card catalogue will aid in quickly locating any book by title or author.

While the amount spent for books is less than that spent in the previous year, the number bought (not far from 100) is hardly less, because many excellent books, written to hold the interest of both young people and their elders, are now available at moderate prices.—And right here must be mentioned the addition of a case of much needed double shelving to hold the increasing number of volumes properly arranged. Before that many had to be spread on window-seats or piled on top of the wall-cases. This occupies almost the last floor space available for book cases.

The proposal to install a small oil-heating equipment similar to some used in the kitchens of the village, was postponed in order to burn the firewood left over from last year. The advantage of the oil heat is that the building could be kept constantly at a moderate temperature of 50° to 60° during severe winter weather, and so avoid the extremes between penetrating “frost” and the slow process of heating the great room to be safely comfortable for the visitors and librarian during two afternoons in the week.

sisting of representatives of the Town, the Precinct and the School District, and request the Precinct Commissioners to prepare a suitable vote embodying the principle to be introduced in the Annual meetings of the Town, the Precinct and the School District in 1932.

Article 7. Voted, that the preliminary report of the Zoning Commission be accepted and that the Commission be instructed to hold public hearings thereon and make its final report at the adjourned Annual Meeting of the Precinct to be held at the Nugget Theater in Hanover, N. H., on the 29th day of April, 1931, at 8:30 o'clock in the evening.

Article 8. Voted, to authorize the Precinct Commissioners to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet the Precinct's obligations until the taxes are collected and paid into the Treasury of the Precinct.

Voted, that upon all taxes on real and personal property a discount of three per cent. (3%) be allowed the taxpayer if paid on or before July 15, 1931.

## REPORT OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

February 1, 1932

To the Commissioners of the Precinct of Hanover, N. H.:

Report of the Fire Department for the year ending January 31, 1932.

The Fire Department is a volunteer company with apparatus as follows:

One 1½ ton Ford 200 gal. pumper carrying 1000 feet 1½ inch hose, with 150 gal. booster tank, 300 feet 1 inch hose and one deck gun for large streams.

One Maxim 500 gal. pumper carrying 1300 feet 2½ inch hose with an 80 gallon booster tank with 250 feet 1 inch hose and 2 ladders.

One Maxim ladder truck with 250 feet of ladders and an 80 gallon booster tank with 250 feet 1 inch hose.

One International 350 gal. pumper carrying 1000 feet 2½ inch hose and two ladders.

A Gamewell Fire Alarm System with 22 boxes and 5 extra call numbers to take care of districts not already covered by boxes and switchboard batteries and battery charging outfit.

During 1931 the Company answered 46 alarms.

5 false alarms  
14 still alarms  
24 regular alarms  
3 out of town calls

The company is divided into three groups each group having fire drills once a month during the summer.

## REPORT OF HEALTH DEPARTMENT

February 1, 1932

To the Commissioners of the Precinct of Hanover, N. H.:

Report of the Health Department for the year ending January 31, 1932.

During the past year milk licenses were granted, after dairy inspection, to thirty-two distributors of milk in the Precinct.

Most of these men buy milk from other producers. In order to safeguard the milk supply inspections were made of these dairies also.

Over one hundred milk samples were taken and tested and other samples were sent to the State Laboratory in Concord.

Two Pasteurizing Plants which furnish milk to the Precinct have been erected during the past year and are under fairly constant supervision.

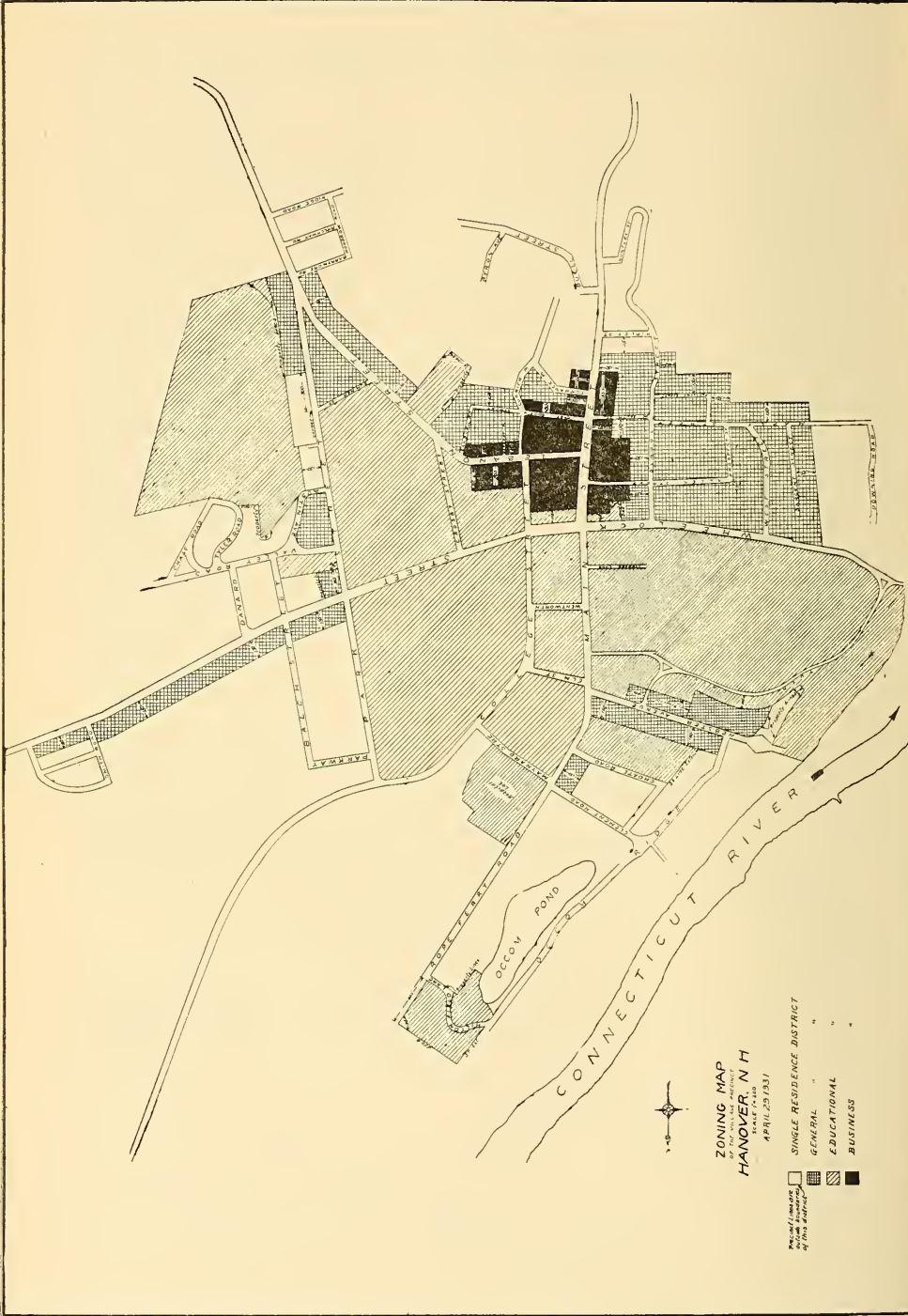
The few nuisances which were reported were investigated and corrected or at least ameliorated.

From March to the end of the past year one hundred and fifty-two cases of contagious diseases were reported and quarantine enforced in those instances where it is required by law.

To accomplish the above inspections and investigations, the Health Officer covered a distance of more than six hundred and fifty miles.

VILLAGE PRECINCT OF HANOVER, NEW  
HAMPSHIRE—ZONING ORDINANCE

To promote the health, safety, convenience and general welfare of the community by regulating and restricting the use and construction of buildings and premises in the Village Precinct of Hanover, and for said purposes dividing the precinct into districts, the following ordinance is hereby enacted by the voters of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H., in official meeting convened:—

SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICTS

(a) The Village Precinct of Hanover is hereby divided as shown on the Zoning Map dated April 29, 1931, and filed with the Board of Precinct Commissioners, into four classes of districts:

- Single residence districts
- General residence districts
- Educational districts
- Business districts

*Cases of Lots in Two Districts*

(b) Where a district boundary line divides a lot in a single or joint ownership of record at the time such line is adopted, the regulations for the less restricted portion of such lot shall extend not more than thirty feet into the more restricted portion, provided the lot has frontage on a street in the less restricted district.

SECTION 2. SINGLE RESIDENCE DISTRICT USES

In a single residence district no building or premises shall be erected, altered or used for any purpose except:

1. Detached one-family dwelling or pair of semi-detached one-family dwellings;
2. Church;
3. Farm or garden, excluding any use injurious, noxious or offensive to the neighborhood;
4. Accessory use customarily incident to any of the above

uses. The term "accessory use" in this ordinance shall not include:

(a) Any use injurious, noxious or offensive to the neighborhood;

(b) Any use not on the same lot with the building to which it is accessory;

(c) The taking of more than four lodgers in a single residence district;

(d) The sale of produce not raised on the premises;

(e) Garage space for more than two automobiles not owned by occupants of the lot;

(f) Signs except those pertaining to the lease, sale or use of a lot or building on which placed, and not exceeding a total area of eight square feet; on a lot occupied by a dwelling there shall not be more than one such sign pertaining to the use thereof or bearing the name or occupation of an occupant for each family house and no such sign shall exceed one square foot in area.

5. Any of the following uses, provided the Board of Adjustment shall rule that such use is not injurious, noxious, offensive or detrimental to the neighborhood:

(a) Cemetery;

(b) Greenhouse or nursery;

(c) Hospital, sanitarium, or philanthropic use;

(d) Golf course;

(e) Municipal use.

### SECTION 3. GENERAL RESIDENCE DISTRICT USES

In a general residence district no building or premises shall be erected, altered or used for any purpose except:

1. Any use permitted in a single residence district;

2. Dwelling, including lodging or rooming houses and boarding houses;

3. Club, except clubs the chief activity of which is a service customarily carried on as a business.

4. Telephone exchange, not including a service station or outside storage of supplies ;

5. Accessory use customarily incident to any of the above uses.

#### SECTION 4. EDUCATIONAL DISTRICT USES

In an educational district no building or premises shall be erected, altered or used for any purpose except :

1. Any use permitted in a general residence district.

2. Educational use, or dormitory, heating plant, hotel, eating place, hospital or greenhouse incidental to and controlled by an educational institution ;

3. Accessory use customarily incident to any of the above uses.

#### SECTION 5. BUSINESS DISTRICT USES

In a business district no building or premises shall be erected altered or used for any purpose injurious, noxious or offensive to a neighborhood by reason of the emission of odor, fumes, dust, smoke, vibration or noise or any other cause, or for any of the following specified uses unless the Board of Adjustment shall rule that such use under such conditions and in such a building as it may prescribe will not be detrimental or injurious to the neighborhood.

1. Factory or industry ;

2. Filling station ;

3. Garage other than a garage permitted in a single or general residence district ;

4. Junk yard ;

5. Lumber or coal yard ;

6. Public stable or blacksmith shop.

## SECTION 6. NON-CONFORMING USES

### *Continuation of Non-Conforming Uses*

(a) Any lawful building or use of a building or premises or part thereof at the time of the adoption of this ordinance or any amendment thereto may be continued although such building or use does not conform to the provisions thereof.

### *Change or Extension of Non-Conforming Uses*

(b) The Board of Adjustment may order the issuance of a permit for any non-conforming use to be changed to any specified use not substantially different in character or more detrimental or objectionable to a neighborhood, or if in a part of a building or premises designed or intended for such use to be extended throughout such building or premises.

### *Temporary Uses*

(c) In a single residence district the Board of Adjustment may order the issuance of a temporary permit for not more than one year and under such conditions as will safeguard the character of the neighborhood, for a residential use not conforming to the requirements of Section 2.

### *Restoration After Fire*

(d) Nothing herein shall prevent the substantial restoration within one year and continued use of a building damaged by fire or other casualty, provided that in case of damage to a building non-conforming in use, location or structure, to an extent that the estimated cost of such restoration exceeds two-thirds of its fair valuation immediately prior to such damage, the Board of Adjustment so authorizes.

## SECTION 7. HEIGHT REGULATIONS

In a single or general residence district no building except a church shall exceed two and one-half stories in height. The term "half story" shall mean a story in a sloping roof.

## SECTION 8. AREA REGULATIONS

### *Rear Yards*

(a) In a single residence district no building shall be built within twenty-five feet from the rear lot line. In a general residence district no building and in an educational or business district no dwelling other than a hotel shall be built within fifteen feet from the rear lot line.

### *Side Yards*

(b) In a single residence district, except where there is a party wall, no building shall be built within eight feet of a side lot line. In a general residence or educational district, except where there is a party wall, no building shall be built with a side wall within five feet of a side lot line. In a business district no dwelling shall be built with a side wall within the distance required in a general residence district from a side lot line unless contiguous thereto.

### *Front Yards*

(c) In a single residence district no building shall be built nearer to any street line than the maximum set-back observed by two-thirds of the buildings on the same side of the street to right and to left as far in either direction as an intersecting street, but not exceeding a distance of five hundred feet in any case; provided, however, that if within such limits less than one-third of the lots are built upon, the set-back shall be forty feet unless the Board of Adjustment shall rule that a lesser set-back will safeguard the character of the district. In a general residence or educational district no building shall be built within ten feet of the street line.

### *Corner Clearance*

(d) In a single or general residence or educational district within the area formed by the lines of intersecting streets and a line joining points on such lines fifteen feet distant from their point of intersection, or in case of a rounded corner the point of intersection of their tangents, no structure, fence or vegetation shall be maintained above a height three and one-half feet above the plane through their curb grades.

### *Accessory Buildings*

(e) On a lot occupied by a one or two-family dwelling, a one-story building of accessory use thereto may be located in and occupy not more than thirty per cent of the rear yard of such dwelling. No yards are required for such building by this ordinance.

### *Projections*

(f) Nothing herein shall prevent the projection of window sills, belt courses and other ornamental features not more than three inches into any required yard, nor the projection of cornices not more than eighteen inches into any required yard, nor the projection of an uncovered porch not more than five feet into any required rear or front yard.

### *Appurtenant Open Space*

(g) No lot shall be so reduced that the dimensions of any of the open spaces shall be smaller than herein prescribed. No yard or other open space required for a building by this ordinance shall during the life of such building be occupied by or counted as open space for another building.

## SECTION 9. ENFORCEMENT

### *Enforcement by Board of Precinct Commissioners*

(a) This ordinance shall be enforced by the Board of Precinct Commissioners. No building or structure or part thereof shall be erected, altered or moved and no premises or structure or part thereof hereafter erected, or altered wholly or partly in use or structure, or moved, or the open spaces of which are in any way reduced, shall be used without a permit from said Board.

### *Board of Adjustment*

(b) Within thirty days after the adoption of this ordinance and thereafter as terms expire, or vacancies occur, the board of precinct commissioners shall make appointments to a board of adjustment conforming in membership and duties to the provisions of Sections 54 to 60 inclusive of Chapter 42 of the Public Laws, as amended. The board of adjustment shall act on all



matters within its jurisdiction under this ordinance in the manner prescribed in said statutes, and subject always to the rule that due consideration shall be given to conserving the public health, safety, convenience, welfare and property values.

*Penalty*

(c) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars for each day of such violation.

SECTION 10. VALIDITY

(a) The invalidity of any section or provision of this ordinance shall not invalidate any other section or provision hereof.

*When Effective*

(b) This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
