#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants in the town of Hanover in the County of Grafton, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in the town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Barrows Hall in Etna in said Hanover on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2nd. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3rd. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty dollars, the same to be expended for flags to decorate soldiers' graves.

4th. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate in all or part to be expended as may be necessary under the direction of the selectmen in cooperation with the state and federal agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread of the disease commonly known as pine blister rust.

5th. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may be legally brought before said meeting.

#### HANOVER TOWN LIBRARY REPORT

Volumes given: 1 vol. by Mrs. Ralph Staebner; Town books 56.

The whole number of volumes in Library at this time nearly 4,000, including reports, pamphlets unnumbered, which accumulate in a Library every year. Five books bought with fines, making in all the books bought for Library 61.

Town Librarian would say that the Library is gaining more and more borrowers each year.

*Voted:* To raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, the same to be expended or such part thereof as may be necessary under the direction of the Selectmen in co-operation with the State and Federal Agents engaged in the work of exterminating and preventing the spread of the disease commonly known as Pine Blister Rust, it being understood that a like amount shall be available from both the State and Federal Governments

*l'oted:* To raise and appropriate the sum of twenty dollars, the same to be expended for flags to decorate soldiers' graves.

Voted: To discontinue a portion of the highway known as Webster Avenue for the purpose of widening and straightening said highway, provided that land for such purpose is supplied without cost to the town, and to authorize the selectmen to take any action necessary to put this vote into effect.

*Voted:* That upon all taxes upon real or personal property paid on or before the 15th day of July, 1921, a discount of five per cent be allowed the taxpayer, and upon all taxes upon real and personal estate paid on or before the 15th day of September, 1921 a discount of three percent be allowed the taxpayer, and that notice be given to all persons having taxes unpaid on October first, and that the fee of twenty cents provided by law be added to all such bills.

Voted: To accept the reports of the town officers as printed in the annual report.

The Committee appointed to select and erect a memorial to the soldiers in the world war not being ready to make a report, it was voted to grant said committee an extension of time.

The following resolution introduced by Professor Charles F. Emerson was adopted by the meeting, viz: "Resolved that the voters of Hanover in town meeting express by vote their sympathy to Horace F. Hoyt in his present illness, and consequent absence from his customary place on town meeting day, and also extend to him their hearty appreciation of his many services in town affairs so generously rendered in the past."

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of Hanover, March 8th, 1921, the following votes of those present and qualified to vote for Senator, were by them given in to the Moderator, and said Moderator, in said meeting, in presence of the Selectmen and Clerk, sorted and counted said votes, and at the close of the poll made a public declaration of the whole number of tickets given in, with the number of votes for and against each proposed amendment, as follows:

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, qualified to vote in town affairs on Thursday the 17th day of November, 1921, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at Barrows' Hall in said town, the meeting was called to order by Harry E. Burton the Moderator, the warrant under which the meeting was called was read by the clerk, after which proceeded to the business under the article for which said meeting was called, viz:

"To relinquish and do hereby relinquish all rights we may have as citizens of said Hanover or otherwise, in and unto Barrows' Hall situated in the village of Etna in said Hanover".

Discussion ensued participated in by Scott Sloane of Lebanon for the petitioner, and Dr. John M. Gile, Roy Brackett and Ransom S. Cross of Hanover for the citizens of the town.

Dr. Gile introduced a motion "that citizens assembled here do not relinquish their right in Barrows' Hall so called".

A yea and nay vote was taken upon the motion, but the Moderator was unable to decide the vote, and it appearing that many of the voters did not understand the motion, it was amended by Dr. Gile so that the motion read as follows:

"Voted that the citizens assembled here do relinquish their right in Barrows' Hall so called".

In voting upon said motion a division of the house was made resulting as follows:

In favor of relinquishing the rights of the citizens in said Hall 57 votes.

Against relinquishing the rights of the citizens in said Hall 85 votes, and the motion was declared lost.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Village Precinct in the town of Hanover, in the county of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in Precinct affairs:

You the hereby notified to meet in the Nugget theatre in said Village, on Thursday the 16th day of March, 1922, at 8.30 P.M. o'clock, to vote on the following subjects:

First: To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting, the same to be chosen by ballot.

Second: To choose by ballot a clerk to serve for the term of one year.

Third: To hear the reports of Precinct Commissioners, treasurer and auditor, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Fourth: To choose by ballot a treasurer and auditor, each to serve for one year, and one precinct commissioner to serve for three years.

Sixth: To raise such sums of money as shall be necessary to take over any existing sidewalks, to construct new sidewalks or to purchase any new equipment needed for the

construction of sidewalks or roads, or such as may be needed for the upkeep and care of existing sidewalks or highways.

Seventh: To see if the precinct will vote to raise the sum of \$400 to assist in securing a band for outdoor concerts during the months of July and August, 1922.

Eighth: To see what action the precinct will take in regard to the Curfew Law which was adopted March 14th, 1921 for one year.

Ninth: To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

### ANNUAL MEETING

Hanover, N. H., March 14, 1921.

A meeting of the legal voters of the Village Precinct of Hanover, N. H. was called to order by E. J. Bartlett at 8.30 P.M.

The warrant was read by the clerk.

Article 1: E. J. Bartlett was elected moderator for one year.

Article 2: I. W. Leavitt was elected clerk for one year.

Article 3: The reports of the Precinct Commissioners and Treasurer were read and accepted. The report of the Auditor passed over.

Article 4: Alfred W. Guyer was elected Treasurer for one year. William R. Gray was elected Auditor for one year. Roland A. Lewin was elected Commissioner for three (3) years.

Article 5: Voted to raise the sum of \$10,500.00 for expenses as itemized in the budget for 1921-1922.

Article 6: Voted to pass article six as this was included in the budget.

Article 7: Voted to adopt the Curfew Law of New Hampshire with amendment; that the Precinct of Hanover adopt the Curfew Law of New Hampshire for one year and that the Commissioners be authorized to arrange for putting it into effect not later than April 1, 1921.

Article 8: Voted that upon all taxes on personal property and upon real estate paid on or before the 15th

day of July, 1921 a discount of 5% be allowed the tax payer and that upon taxes upon personal property and real estate paid on or before the 15th day of September, 1921, a discount of 3% be allowed the tax payer and that all persons having unpaid taxes on October 1st, 1921, be notified and that twenty cents be added to such bills, as provided by law.

Voted that the Precinct Commissioners be and hereby are authorized to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Precinct before the taxes can be raised, collected and paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the Precinct.

Voted that the Precinct Commissioners be empowered to make such trade with Mrs. Dyke and Ellis for widening and improving the corner of School and South Streets by moving their house as in their judgment seems best for the Precinct and if satisfactory arrangements can be made to proceed with the work.

Voted that the thanks of the Precinct be extended to F. W. and F. F. Davison for the use of The Nugget Theatre for this evening.

Adjourned at 9.20 P.M.

This makes a total for State Aid Road work of \$23,523.71 in place of an estimated expenditure of \$17,-000.00. This was made possible by an agreement with the State Highway Department by which funds of the Precinct were transferred from State Aid Construction to State Aid Maintenance. This transfer was very advantageous to the Precinct as on all this money transferred the Precinct received fifty cents from the State, instead of twenty cents, for each dollar spent. This additional amount from the state took care of the additional expenditure.

The truck was bought because it was found the old truck would not do the work required of it. The scarifier was bought because it was absolutely essential in view of the large amount of repair work to be done on the highways.

The street drainage was put in on an offer from Dartmouth College to pay half the expense if the drains on Crosby Street and South Park could be put in at once. This offer was accepted and the work was done.

The total expenditure beyond the budget of about eleven thousand dollars leaves a total deficit of only three thousand dollars for the year. If the regular budget for the next year is voted with an item to make up this amount the Precinct tax will be \$11,500.00 for the year instead of \$10,500.00 as last year. If the deficit is spread over a period of one or two years the Precinct Tax may be the same as last year or one thousand dollars less.
