**Instructions-** Sow seeds outdoors after danger of frost has passed and soil and air temperatures have warmed. Harvest snap beans frequently for increased yields. Leave some pods on the vine and harvest when completely mature for dry beans.

## 1486 - **Pencil Pod Golden Wax** (*Phaseolus vulgaris*)

*Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950*

This old-time favorite, introduced in 1900, is regaled for its quality and delicious wax bean flavor. The stringless pods reach 5-7" long on heavy-producing plants that grow 15-20" tall. Ideal for freezing or canning. Bush habit, wax, 50-65 days.

1505 - **Provider** (*Phaseolus vulgaris*)

Known as the most dependable early green bean, this easy-to-grow variety offers excellent flavor and is one of the best for freezing and canning. It germinates well in cooler soil, adapts to diverse soil and climate conditions, and is disease-resistant. Round, straight pods (5-8" long) grow heavily on compact plants. Introduced in 1965 by horticulturist Dr. Hoffman of the U.S. Vegetable Laboratory in South Carolina. **Bush habit, snap, 50-55 days.**



## 0611A - **Burpee's Golden** (*Beta vulgaris*)

A standout beet, offering both excellent roots and sweet, flavorful, edible greens that are ideal for sautéing. Introduced in 1970 by Burpee Seed Company, it has orange, globe-shaped roots that turn golden-yellow when cooked, are tender and mild-flavored (even when large), and will not bleed like red beets. 50-55 days.

### Learn To Grow It

**Direct Seed**  
2" Apart

**Seed Depth**  
1/2"

**Rows Apart**  
20-24"


**Thin**

**Instructions-** Sow seeds outdoors as soon as soil can be worked in spring. Seeds will germinate in 5-10 days. Beets can be planted at two-week intervals for a steady harvest. All parts of the beet plant are edible.

0348A - **Calabrese** (*Brassica oleracea*)

*Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950*

This historic and delicious variety dates back to the 1880s, when it was brought to America by Italian immigrants. Tight heads can grow up to 8" in diameter. After the central head is harvested, many side shoots will form, and they can be harvested right up to frost. 58-90 days from transplant.

**Learn To Grow It**

<b>Start Indoors</b>	<b>Germination</b>	<b>Plant Outdoors</b>	<b>Light</b>
6-8 Weeks before last frost	3-10 Days	24" Apart	Full Sun

**Instructions-** Sow seeds indoors ¼" deep. Plant out just before the last frost. Broccoli prefers cool temperatures and a regular supply of water. In many regions it can be grown as both a spring and fall crop.

## BEETS

*Beta vulgaris*

**SEED SPECS:** Seeds/lb.: Avg. 37,000. Avg. Direct Seeding Rate: 1M/66', 5M/333', 436M/acre @ 15 seeds/ft., rows 18" apart. Packet: 350 seeds, sows 23'. Pelleted seed: Pellets/lb.: Avg. 10,500. Avg. Direct Seeding Rate: 1M/80–160', 174,200–348,500 pellets/acre @ 6–12 pellets/ft., rows 18" apart. Packet: 250 pellets, sows 20–40'. **Note:** Pelleted seed should be used within one year of purchase.

**CULTURE:** Premium crops grow quickly in light or loamy soils with a pH of 6.0–8.0. Cool temperatures produce best flesh color. Acute spikes of hot weather can cause white rings ("zoning") in the roots.

*Transplant* – Sow indoors in flats or cell-type containers about 5–6 weeks before transplanting to the garden. Sow seeds about ½" deep, 3–4 seeds per inch. After danger of heavy frost, transplant at 3" spacing, in rows 12–18" apart.

*Direct seed* – Begin early sowings when soil has warmed to 45°F/7°C. Sow 15 seeds/ft., ½" deep, rows 12–18" apart. Thin to 1 plant per 2". For winter storage, sow about 10 weeks before heavy freeze is expected.

**DISEASES AND PESTS:** Rotate crops to prevent *Cercospora* leaf spot, and keep beets well irrigated to prevent "scab". Refer to the catalog for further information.

**HARVEST:** *Greens* – Pull out plants in bunches when the roots are still small, under 1" diameter.

*Roots* – When roots are desired size, fork and lift plants.

**STORAGE:** Cut tops, wash, hydrocool, and store up to 6 months at 32°F/0°C and 95% relative humidity.

## 0913 - Long Island Improved (*Brassica oleracea*)

*Historic variety - Introduced to the U.S. seed trade before 1950*

A single stalk of this variety can bear 50-100 dark-green Brussels sprouts (florets) over an extended period. Compact plants produce sturdy spikes with edible florets that mature from the bottom up and take on sweeter tones after a light frost. Introduced in the 1890s, this historic variety was once the most important commercial sprout in the United States. Brussels sprouts mature 80-115 days from transplant.

### Learn To Grow It

<b>Start Indoors</b> 6-8 Weeks before last frost	<b>Germination</b> 5-10 Days	<b>Plant Outdoors</b> 24" Apart	<b>Light</b> Full Sun

**Instructions-** In cool climates, sow seeds indoors early, 4-6 weeks before the last frost. In warmer climates, Brussels sprouts can be direct sown for a spring harvest. Plant ¼" deep. A slow-growing, long-season vegetable that requires an even supply of water, Brussels sprouts also survive frost and light snowfalls.
