To the inhabitants of the town of Hanover, in the county of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs. - 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of twenty-five dollars each for the repair of the hearses in the east part and the west part of the town.
- 7. To see what action the town will take in relation to the town farm, or pass any vote relating thereto.
- 8. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto, and transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

BOARD OF EDUCATION, DISTRICT NO. 1.

We herewith submit our report upon the work of the schools of the Village Precinct for the spring term of the year 1900-1901, and the fall and winter terms of the year 1901-1902.

The High School has been under the management of Principal Edgar A. Kaharl, whose efficient discipline and instruction had been well proved during the two years preceding. The continuance of the same head of the school for three years has been of very great value. Mr. Kaharl has the school thoroughly in hand, the order and organization are admirable, and each year has left the school upon a higher plane.

Miss M. Lenore Flint has also remained in the same position as last year, that of instructor in Latin and English, The teacher of Mathematics and Physical Science, Mr. Frank M. Howe, serving under the arrangement with the trustees of the Moor's Charity School, resigned at the close of the spring term to accept a position as instructor in the Conference Seminary at Montpelier. His place was filled by the appointment of two men, each to do one half the work carried by Mr. Howe, with the exchange of the department of French for a part of the work in Mathematics. Under this arrangement Mr. Fred W. Gentleman teaches a part of the Mathematics, with Physics and Chemistry, and Mr. Thomas A. Mason teaches all classes in French. Both men are graduates of the college of the class of 1901 and members of the Graduate Department of Pedagogy. Each had followed throughout his college course the department in which he is now teaching, and maintained a high position as a scholar. It is of great value to the school to be able to command the services of men from year to year who have had unusual training in the studies which they teach.

During the spring term Mr. A. E. Buck, then a Senior in college, rendered valuable service without compensation in teaching a class in Cicero, and this year Mr. L. P. Benezet of the class of 1900, now a member of the Graduate Department of Pedagogy, is rendering similar service.

The incoming class has entered upon the new course of study mentioned in our last report, a course which covers five years. The first year is designed to serve as a transition from the work of the grammar school to the more difficult courses of the high school. Those who begin Latin can take it up in a more simple way, and advance slowly. Those who do not take Latin have opportunity for a simple introduction to Natural Science.

The large recitation room on the third floor of the addition to the school building, which was left unfinished at the time of building, has this year been finished and is now in use as a laboratory and recitation room. It makes some laboratory work in Physics and Chemistry possible. As soon as money can be appropriated for suitable apparatus this work can be much enlarged. It is of the highest importance to the school. The room is large and pleasant, and is a great addition to our facilities.

The hall has been furnished with electric lights during the past year so that it is now available for school entertainments and exercises in the evening.

The addition of a year at the beginning of the high school course has relieved the pressure of work in the grammar school. Here Miss Bickford has continued the strong, steady work which has marked her long service in the school. Not a little of the success of the high school has been due to the fact that the work of the school next below has been so thoroughly done.

The marriage of Miss Tuell in the summer left a vacancy in the intermediate school. Miss Tuell had brought her school to a very high degree of efficiency. The life and energy with which she inspired the pupils, the excellent order of the room, and the real progress in their studies, were a great means of development to the children at a very critical period of their work. Miss Tuell's successor, Miss Muzzey, has in every way maintained the high standard of the school. A thorough training in the Normal School at Plymouth, and a year of very successful teaching at Littleton, gave assurance that Miss Muzzey would be successful. Her work is proving most efficient, and the school was never in better condition. The addition of systematic training in vocal music in the room is greatly appreciated.

The Second Primary room has profited by the continuances of Miss Applebee as teacher. The school had suffered by the necessity of frequent changes of teacher, and it was no easy task to bring it up to its present condition.

The Primary School continues to be a delight to the children and their parents; Miss Rowe is a teacher of rare ability, and she makes her school a charming introduction to school life for the very little children. By the system of half-day sessions she is caring this year for an unusually large number of children.
