We have included the annual dues in the next budget and will surely let you now beforehand if we feel in the need of any other expenses hereafter.

Things go on much the same at the Etna Library. Mona Abbas is doing a good job as librarian. The most disturbing thing is the cost of heating. We have again spoken to Mrs. Abbas and Gordon Hayes, janitor, about the necessity of turning the thermostat completely back between the hours the library is actually open. And will check on this carefully. There is no water in the building so this can be done. Perhaps the Wednesday night hours are not worth the extra expense of heating the building. Mrs. Abbas feels that many of the school children in the village do plan on using the books -- sometimes as many as twenty books go out on a Wednesday night but more often an average of four. She feels an encyclopedia would be very helpful and we have included a figure in the next budget for one.
